ACTIVITY OF THE WEEK – CHINESE NEW YEAR

This week the children have been learning about Chinese New Year. We have learnt that it is the Year of the Rabbit and have been exploring Chinese letters by trying to write them ourselves.

The children worked together to make our dragon head and body for our Dragon Dance this Thursday. We then watched and practiced the lion and dragon dances in preparation for our own parade.

The children learnt that, in China, the





colour red represents good luck, and this is why many people wear red to start off a new year. We shared similarities of how we celebrate new year in our homes in comparison with Chinese New Year. The children shared that they go to mosques, temples or churches to welcome the new year and that they also eat delicious food.

The children prepared Stir Fried Noodles for their classmates and ate them together in the afternoon. The children enjoyed trying the stir fried noodles, with many saying they have had similar food at home.

We have enjoyed exploring Chinese New Year and making links to our own experiences during celebrations. Happy New Year!
