Panda Class loved their trip to the Museum of London Docklands. They sang songs to the melodies of a ukulele, composed their own song with actions and learnt about the history of the docks and compared the human features we see in our area now.

The children later explored the Mudlarks gallery, where they had fun playing with water, soft play,





artefacts and role play.

Panda Class collaborated to locate and recognise the names of the seas that surround the British Isles. Nikita predicted "I think the blue area on the map is the water" before using atlases to find the names of the seas.

In Maths, the children have compared numbers using greater than, less than and equal to symbols. Maria noticed a pattern and said "If I know 3 is less than 9, then we can say 9 is greater than 3." What a wonderful week of learning and play!

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BLUE WHALE AND TIGER CLASSES



This week the children have been exploring their sense of taste through our story The Very Hungry Caterpillar. We began by learning that we use our tongue to taste what we eat and drink, and that there are little bumps on our tongues called taste buds. We used vocabulary such as 'sweet', 'bitter', 'sour', 'bland' and 'spicy' to describe some of the foods and drink we tasted.

The children enjoyed our mystery tasting activity where they tried something sweet, bitter, bland and sour. The children said the dark chocolate was bitter and sweet, that the orange drink tasted like water and that the lemon was sour!

Later in the week we sampled some of the fruits the hungry



caterpillar ate and decided which was our favourite. The children glued a picture of themselves onto a chart so that we could see how many children liked which fruit best. Many of the children made comments such as "Wow! Lots of children like strawberries" and "Only some children like plums."

During our cooking session this week the children learnt how to safely use the toaster to make toast. Each child was able to demonstrate how to use the toaster safely and to ask for an adult to help remove the toast. Everyone enjoyed buttering the toast they made themselves.
