

Panda class were engrossed in their Design and Technology day, designing vehicles which they have then created using a range of materials. They were working hard on the 'success criteria' for 'What makes a good vehicle?' and they considered the wheels that need to turn, the chassis the car needs as well as the infrastructure to enable the car to stay upright. Design and technology draws on so many other skills related to STEM including problem solving, predicting, testing, refining and evaluating. Hopefully one day they will actually be building and showing their own cars off to Lewis Hamilton in the STEM academy! Look out for the vehicles which will be displayed in the foyer museum.

In reception class, the children were also putting their designing skills in action by making unique Christmas decorations for their role play area. I observed some wonderful collaborative problem solving when the handmade bauble wouldn't stay on the tree branch!

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### Panda Class news...

Zoom, zoom! Panda Class have been busy designing, creating and evaluating their own moving vehicles. We had our first Design and Technology (DT) day where the class were immersed into new vocabulary, drawing their design ideas and exploring new building strategies using wheels, axels and washers. The children built a chassis (shah-see) and connected their vehicle body on top. The final part of our DT Day involved children evaluating and talking about their final vehicles. We discussed what makes a successful moving vehicle. Children shared that it needs to have moving wheels, it needs a chassis to keep the wheels turning and there needs to be washers in place to stop the wheels from falling out. Our classroom is busy with lots of models of vehicles that children recognise in our home city. The resilience and kindness that shone on the day through their individual hard work and team work was outstanding.
