## Panda Class news

Ready, steady go! Panda Class have started their PE sessions at In2Sports hall. The children showed fantastic behaviour walking to the hall, changing in and out of their PE kits in the new changing room and then using the hall space and floor markings to practise their gymnastics. In Science, children have been exploring recognising trees and sorting deciduous and evergreen trees. They have collected leaves to classify local trees and used the Woodland Trust website to read more facts about trees. Vytis found out that an Oak tree grows acorns and has purple/brown twigs.

In Maths, children have been using a number line to add and subtract numbers to 10. The children have been thinking of their own number stories to solve. They have enjoyed using dominoes to think of addition and subtraction number sentences.

### Updates from Sarah Jane

Recently we took part in a development day with a Read, Write Inc consultant. It was a busy day with a full agenda including; observing teaching staff and lesson coaching, working with the leadership team on the early reading strategy and guiding support staff on 1:1 pupil tutoring. A really fantastic piece of feedback was about the assessments we had recently carried out and how accurate they were, meaning that pupils are being both supported and challenged in reading, making excellent progress. She was particularly impressed with where the year one cohort are in terms of their reading ability and where you would expect them to be at this time of year. This goes to show that the strong foundation of the teaching of reading in reception and the continued high standards in year one is having a strong impact, not to forget the wonderful reading experiences our parents give their children.

It was fantastic to see so many parents attend the phonics and early reading workshops recently. I am going to share some interesting mind blowing stats about children who are read to and the words they learn:

The Word Gap, At 5 years old: Never read to: 4622 words 1-2 times a week: 63,570 words 3-5 times a week: 169,520 words Daily: 296, 600 words Five books a day: 1,483,300 words
