# Blue Whale and Tiger Class news...

As we open a door to Africa the children have been learning all about the difference between life in the UK and life in Africa. The children discussed the safari animals that live in parts of Africa, the different types of fruit that grow there, and how the weather can vary in comparison to the UK. As we gain an understanding of African traditions, we learnt about weaving and how it was part of their culture since 5000BC. Blue whale and Tiger learnt how to weave a 'Checkerboard Weave.'

While we also focus on our topic book 'The gingerbread Man', this week the children baked their own versions of gingerbread men using golden syrup. They worked as a class to create their own recipe and later followed the steps to create their delicious goods. The following week we will be discussing what went well with our recipe, and what could we add to make it better.

Panda Class have been busy writing their retell of 'Oi Get Off Our Train'. They have sequenced and used their story maps to help them write their stories. They have all used the strategy of **think it**, **say it**, **write it and check** it to help them structure their writing. Madina, Avyaan and Yashveer read their work to the class. We have focused on re reading our own writing to help us to spot missing words, punctuation or mistakes.

In Maths, we have been using dienes to support our understanding of place value to 50. Frederick shared that the **number before 38 is 37**, I know this because it has 3 tens and 7 ones and that is 1 less one than 38. What a brilliant explanation.

In Science, Panda Class have been working scientifically to carry out a fair test to find the best material for a toddlers dungarees. They tested different materials to see how many times they had to rub the fabric on the concrete before it got torn.


















#### STAR OF THE WEEK
