

They participated enthusiastically to a story session learning about the history of the ship, how it got its name and what life was like on the ship. This trip enhanced our History learning on transport of London. The children took the chance to experience a mode of transport from the past and then compared it to a modern mode of transport as we used the DLR to return to school.

Children have been learning about length and height and measuring using cubes and paperclips (measuring using non-standard units). There was so much excitement to measure objects in the classroom including themselves.

Panda class were memorized by Clare Luther as they engaged in an author visit. Clare's books have quickly become a class favourite in our book corner and some of the characters have made a big impression on the children.

The children loved joining in with the story and Clare's enthusiasm during the session.

The children have been learning to retell the story of the Little Red Hen and all the hard work she put into making the bread. They have begun making story maps to help retell the story to their friends. On Friday, the children made bread using the recipe from our story. They mixed the flour, kneaded the dough, watched it rise and then baked the bread. The children loved eating their buttered bread while it was still warm.
