Year 1 pupils had an incredible half term filled with exciting learning experiences! They delved into the fascinating lives of Mary Anning and David Attenborough, two remarkable figures who have made significant contributions to our understanding of the natural world.

Panda Class have enjoyed hands-on activities, eagerly measuring water with various containers to understand capacity and volume. Their faces light up with excitement as they pour, compare, and discover the differences between full, half-full, empty, nearly full and nearly empty. Year 1 pupils have been working hard in phonics focus on mastering set 3 sounds, which are essential for developing strong reading skills. 
