What a joyful week it's been as the children embraced the warm sunshine and took full advantage of the great outdoors! There was plenty of water play, laughter, and learning as the children explored *capacity* through pouring, filling, and splashing with containers of all shapes and sizes. It was wonderful to see their teamwork and curiosity flourish in such a playful and hands-on way.

Indoors, the magic of storytelling continued with a deep dive into the classic tale of Jack and the Beanstalk. The children listened, asked thoughtful questions, and began to understand the story in more detail. But the adventure didn't stop there — they used their amazing imaginations to create their own endings! Alice envisioned "a unicorn upside down house at the top of my beanstalk." Nafis said, "I will see a car racetrack at the top of my beanstalk."

It's been a joy to watch their creativity grow just like Jack's magical beanstalk. Their ideas have been imaginative, and we can't wait to see what adventures next week will bring.







This week in Tiger Class, we've been closely observing how our plants are growing – it's been amazing to see how quickly they change in such a short space of time! The children have loved checking in on them each day and spotting new shoots and leaves. Their curiosity and excitement have really brought our classroom to life.

As part of our literacy work, we created a story map and put together a performance of *Jack and the Beanstalk*, which the children performed with such enthusiasm. The video is now available on Tapestry – please do take a look!

In maths, we've been exploring numbers between 10 and 20, with a big focus on number patterns and place value. The children have been working hard to understand how these numbers are made and how they fit into the number system.

We've also been busy with our final rehearsals for the upcoming play, and we are *so* excited to perform it for you next Thursday. We can't wait to see you there and share all the children's hard work and joy on stage!

Elephant Class have been learning...

In Science this week, Elephant Class were grouped into teams named after the four seasons – Spring, Summer, Autumn and Winter – adding a fun and thematic twist to their learning. The children focused on building their scientific vocabulary as they explored key terminology related to how plants grow. They investigated words such as germination, seed dispersal, root, and shoot, using a range of hands-on activities to deepen their understanding.

After discussing the meanings, the children confidently explained each term in their own words, demonstrating a strong grasp of the germination process and the early stages of a plant's life cycle.

It was fantastic to see them using scientific language so thoughtfully and with growing confidence. Building on this learning, the children are now beginning to create their own non-chronological reports to showcase their knowledge, we can't wait to read them and share them with each other!

Lion & Panda Class have been learning...

This week in English Lion Class have started an exciting new book called *Traction Man* written by Mini Grey. We've been using the front cover and illustrations to make predictions about the story and worked in groups to share and record our thoughts. The children have also been exploring and unpicking key vocabulary to deepen their understanding of the text. We have also been describing the main character and writing our own character descriptions.

In Maths, we have been learning about making equal groups and adding them together. The children have used practical resources to group objects and explore repeated addition for example 5+5+5, 2+2+2+2, 10+10.

In Geography, we been learning about what maps are. We identified human and physical features and discussed the differences between them. Lion class quickly spotted lots of different features such as rivers, roads, buildings, and forests.









Year 1 pupils are diving into a variety of engaging topics! In math, they're exploring arrays and practicing counting by 2s, 5s, and 10s. Pupils used arrays to visualise and solve simple multiplication problems. By arranging objects in rows and columns, they can easily see how numbers combine and repeat. This hands-on approach helps them grasp the concept of multiplication as repeated addition. For example, they might create an array with 2 rows of 5 apples each to understand that 2 times 5 equals 10.

Geography lessons are sparking their creativity as they design imaginary maps, learning about different places and describing a location of a place. We have used our love for Traction Man from English to create a map that represented the missions Traction Man encounters. Meanwhile, in science, pupils are revisiting the fascinating features of birds, discussing their unique characteristics. Aliah said birds have 2 wings, a beak and lay hard shelled eggs. Pupils are becoming increasingly confident in classifying animal groups.
