Elephant Class have been learning...

This week has been an exciting one for Elephant Class! We've been consolidating our learning in Geography and Science with a fantastic trip to Eden Docks and the Rooftop Gardens in Canary Wharf. Both groups had a wonderful time exploring the local area and getting creative by decorating bunting. It was heartwarming to see so many parents join us—your support means a lot, and it reminds us how lucky we are to be part of the MWW community.

As part of our ongoing partnership with Canary Wharf, we've also been invited to link our curriculum to the fascinating live science work currently happening in the area. The Canary Wharf Group is undertaking exciting environmental monitoring and ecological studies, and we are incredibly grateful to be part of this. It provides us with a meaningful, real-world context to enrich our Science and Geography lessons. Our visit gave children the chance to observe urban biodiversity in action, ask questions about sustainability and green infrastructure, and connect what they see with National Curriculum skills—such as identifying seasonal and daily weather patterns (Science), recognising physical and human features of the environment (Geography), and developing enquiry and observation skills.

This collaboration brings our learning to life and supports our aim to nurture curious, environmentally aware learners. We're so excited to keep linking our curriculum to what's happening just on our doorstep! For those who couldn't make it, we've included a few snapshots from the day to give you a glimpse into the fun and learning that took place. It truly was a memorable experience—and we're so thankful for the continued partnership with Canary Wharf that makes opportunities like this possible.

Panda and Lion Class have been learning...

Lion Class have been busy writing letters in role as Traction Man, choosing exciting missions from the story to inspire their writing. Using their planning templates, the children carefully structured their letters with creativity and purpose. Their final pieces have been published and proudly displayed in our corridor gallery – make sure to have a look when you pass by!

In Maths we have been learning about quarters in maths, understanding that a quarter means splitting something into four equal parts. We explored how to divide shapes and objects into quarters, making sure each part is the same size. When working with quantities, children practised sharing equally between four groups to find one quarter. In Geography, we created a real map showing the route from our classroom all the way to Sarah Jane's office. Children carefully included and labelled spaces that connected from our classroom.

Once again, it's been a wonderful term full of great learning. Well done to all the children that completed their home projects. Children thoroughly enjoyed presenting their unique superhero stories. Have a wonderful half

term!







Year 1 has been diligently working hard in all their lessons! In science, they've been revising the parts of a plant and understanding their purposes, such as how roots absorb water and nutrients. In maths, pupils have enthusiastically been learning about fractions, focusing on finding and recognising a quarter. They engaged in hands-on activities, such as cutting shapes into four equal parts and identifying one of those parts as a quarter. Through practical exercises like sharing snacks equally among four friends, they grasped the concept of dividing a whole into quarters. Visual aids, like fraction circles and pictures, helped them see how a quarter fits into the whole.

In PSHE, pupils are exploring relationships and the people who help us. They're learning about the importance of friendships and family, understanding how these relationships support and care for us. The lessons also cover recognising when someone is being unkind and knowing how to seek help if needed. This helps children develop empathy, communication skills, and the ability to make safe choices in their interactions with others. It's wonderful to see them engaging with these essential life skills!


