It's been wonderful to see their understanding and language skills grow as they connect their learning across different activities.

Next week we'll be diving into another timeless classic – *The Enormous Turnip*. We're so excited to see the children engage with this story, and we can't wait for the creativity and

learning.







The undisputed highlight of the week in Tiger Class was performing our musical 'The Gingerbread Man' to our parents! Each show was a fantastic success, and I'm sure the parents will agree that the children's hard work over the past several school weeks has really paid off! We will miss our rehearsals, however the songs we have practiced so well as a year group will surely be heard around the reception classrooms again. We are so proud of everyone in Tiger Class!

In other fairytale news, we have been excitedly watching the progress of the beansprouts we have been growing while studying Jack and the Beanstalk! Several of the children have make checking on the plants' progress the first stop of the day. We have been learning new words to describe the plants, including the parts of a plant, such as 'leaves', 'roots' and 'stem', as well as describing words like 'huge' and 'tall.'

In maths we have been learning new ways to add groups together and continuing to develop our ability to describe the mathematical processes we are using.

To finish off the week, we also made a lovely pasta salad to enjoy with our Friday story time. Finally, we are also very proud to have received the Attendance trophy this week. Well done again everyone in Tiger class and have a wonderful weekend!

Elephant Class have been learning...

This week, our pupils continued to make fantastic progress in their Design and Technology unit. They moved on to the second stage of their project, building the axle and further developed their understanding of how moving mechanisms work. With the chassis as their foundation, they successfully assembled their vehicles, demonstrating both creativity and problem-solving skills.

We were also delighted to welcome families back into the classroom for another heartwarming "Give Me Ten" session. This initiative encourages families to spend just ten minutes sharing a story with their child, promoting a love of reading in a simple yet powerful way. These sessions have become a much-loved part of our routine, creating joyful moments and strengthening the important link between home and school. The children are always eager to listen and participate, and it's a real pleasure to witness the smiles and connections these shared stories bring.

Lion & Panda Class have been learning...

In Maths, Lion Class has been learning about halving. We know that it means splitting something into two equal pieces and that two halves make a whole. We also explored how 2D shapes can be halved in different ways such as vertically, horizontally and diagonally. Next week we will be looking at what a quarter means.

In English we orally retold parts of the *Traction Man* story. Working in groups, we used the first person "I" and past tense verbs to write. It was fun to think about all the missions and saving the day from Traction Man's perspective.

In Geography, we learnt about imaginary maps, which are maps that show made-up places and settings. We linked this to English by drawing different settings of Traction Man's missions, such as Planet Duvet, the Sink, the Garden, and the Kitchen, bringing our creative ideas to life through both subjects.









In Year 1, pupils learnt to recognise and find half of an amount, shape, an object. They started by understanding that a half meant dividing something into two equal parts. For example, if they had 8 apples, half would have been 4 apples. Similarly, they learnt to identify half of a shape, like cutting a square into two equal rectangles, or recognising half of an object, such as splitting a chocolate bar into two equal pieces.

In English, pupils have been working extremely hard to improve their writing through re-reading and editing. We have been enjoying the adventures of Traction Man and Scrubbing Brush. Pupils have used drama, drawings and sequencing images to help retell the events of the story. pupils have been using interesting vocabulary such as hoisted, lumbered away, rescued, and zoomed. These are all examples of using the ed suffix. Pupils are applying their understanding of past tense in their writing. Well done Pandas!
