








Blue Whale and Tiger Class have been learning...

This week, the children were introduced to *The Very Hungry Caterpillar*. The story provided an opportunity to explore the life cycle of a caterpillar, something the children were already very familiar with thanks to the real-life caterpillars we have been caring for in class. Having observed the caterpillars grow and change over time, the children were eager to share their knowledge and could confidently talk through each stage—from egg, to caterpillar, to chrysalis, and finally, butterfly. Their enthusiasm and understanding were wonderful to see, and it was clear that having firsthand experience helped deepen their learning.

In addition to their work on the life cycle, the children have also been developing their mathematical thinking through the concept of sharing. They have been learning how to divide items equally among groups, using practical resources to support their understanding. This included recognising when items could not be shared evenly and working together to problem-solve and find fair solutions.

Alongside our science and maths learning, the children have been talking about the importance of healthy eating and making balanced food choices. They have been introduced to the five main food groups—fruits and vegetables, carbohydrates, proteins, dairy. This sparked conversations about which foods help our bodies grow strong and stay healthy. Next week, they will be using what they have learned to create their own healthy, balanced plates, designing meals that include their favourite foods from each group.





This week in Tiger class, we have been learning about the Very Hungry Caterpillar. We have done a fantastic job of learning and retelling the story, including during our PE lesson, in which we thought about the way that different animals, such as a caterpillar and a butterfly, move. We have begun to think about healthy eating, which will be supported in our PSHE lessons over the coming weeks. Though we may need to eat different things to a caterpillar, we agree that the caterpillar in our story went a little bit overboard with the sweet treats on Saturday!

In maths this week we have been learning about sharing. We spoke about how, similarly, to sharing with our friends, it is important to share things in maths fairly and equally. We have been sharing animals, rocks, pencils and anything else we can get our hands on in reception, making sure that each group we make has the same number of objects in it.

We have also had a chat about the special times in the year that we and our families celebrate, in preparation for Eid. Best wishes to everyone celebrating tomorrow!







Elephant Class have been learning...

In Elephant Class, we joyfully celebrate the value of community this week, especially as we explore the wonder and excitement of being seven. Through the power of poetry, we come together to share our voices, ideas, and dreams, creating a warm and welcoming space where every child's expression is treasured. Just as a poem is made stronger by its rhythm and rhyme, our class is enriched by the unique contributions of each child. By supporting one another and working collaboratively, we build lasting friendships and foster a deep sense of belonging.

Working in pairs, the children wrote poems inspired by what it means to be part of Elephant Class. We then combined all their wonderful ideas to create a whole-class poem, which we are excited to perform together for the Key Stage One performance. This process not only nurtured their creativity but also strengthened teamwork and confidence. The articulation of each child seems to grow in strength which is lovely to hear and see.

In art, inspired by the "Creation of Life" artwork, the children designed outlines of sea creatures and mammals using an Aboriginal art technique from Australia. It was fabulous to see each child create two different pictures, experimenting with patterns and symbols to bring their underwater creatures to life. They annotated these explaining what was represented in their pictures giving each piece even more meaning and recognition.


Together, we cultivate a classroom where kindness, creativity, and collaboration thrive, making our shared journey of learning and growing truly special and memorable














Panda and Lion Class have been learning...

In History, we learnt about Neil Armstrong. We found out that he was the first person to walk on the Moon in 1969, what an achievement! We wrote four facts that we learnt about his journey and space exploration. Next week we will look at another astronomer, I wonder who it will be?!

In Maths, we've been learning about directions, focusing on key vocabulary; above, below, left, and right. We learnt a trick to help us remember left and right using our hands — by making an "L" shape with our left hand! It really helped Lion class figure out which way was left, and which was right.

In English, we looked at lots of different poems. We identified alliteration and rhyming words in each poem. Ashvik said, "alliteration is when the sounds are the same at the start of words." Mysha created her own poem, full of amazing alliteration that sits proudly on our English display board, Well done!

This week's value was community, and it was brilliant to see Lion Class work as a team to learn the poem "We Are Six." We can't wait to perform it at our KS1 show!

This week Panda class have been learning all about performing poetry. It is a delightful and enriching experience for young children. Pupils have engaged with simple, rhythmic poems that are easy to memorise and recite, building confidence as they stand in front of the classroom and speak clearly with expression. This practice helps them become comfortable with public speaking, expands their vocabulary, and teaches them about the sounds and rhythms of language. Through creative expression, they experiment with tones, gestures, and facial expressions, fostering a deeper appreciation and a love for literature. We are hoping to share our poetry performances in our KS1 Summer show.

In PSHE, we have started our Changing Me unit and this week we looked at different life cycles. We had interesting discussions and explored the different life cycles that we have seen so far. The pupils loved talking about caterpillars and chicks as well as thinking about storybooks that that represent these changes. Liam was excited to talk about 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'.

In RE, we have been talking about what is means to belong in a faith community. Pupils looked at how Muslims show that they belong to a community and as a class we learnt about this current special time of Eid ul Adha. Eid Mubarak if you are celebrating.
