This week in Elephant Class, the children have been busy publishing their character descriptions, focusing on the imaginative characters from Fantastic Mr Fox by Roald Dahl. They have been using expanded noun phrases to add vivid detail, writing in full sentences, and carefully checking their punctuation-including capital letters, full stops, and commas in lists. It was impressive to see all the pupils thoughtfully planning and editing their work, while choosing grammar and vocabulary that brought their writing to life. Their creativity has truly shone through as they captured the personalities of the Fantastic Mr Fox characters in their own words.

This week in Maths, the children have been learning to tell the time to the nearest five minutes, using both analogue and digital clocks. To support this, they have also been practising their 5 times tables, as counting in fives is a key skill for understanding how the minute hand moves around the clock face. It's been wonderful to see the children making real-life connections and growing in confidence as they use their number knowledge to read the time. Some of us found this a bit tricky, so continued practise at home-especially with counting in fives and reading clocks-would be really helpful and greatly encouraged.


