If a community school receives more applications than places available it will not be possible to offer every child a place. Children with a Statement of Special Educational Needs or an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP), which names the school applied to, will be placed before all other applicants. See page 6 for more information on children with an EHCP.

The remaining places will be filled in the priority order below.

- 1. Children Looked After by the Local Authority, including adopted children who were previously looked after and children who leave care under a special quardianship or residence order This also includes children who were previously in care abroad
- 2. Children for whom it is deemed there is strong medical or social applied to (See Note 1);
- 3. Children living within the catchment area of the school the school (including the school of a separate infants and junior school) and who will continue to do so on the date of admission (See Note 2);
- 4. Children whose parent is a member of staff who has been employed at the school concerned for two or more vears at the time of application and/or children of a member of staff who has been recruited to fill a vacancy for which there is a demonstrable skill shortage

5. Children who live within the catchment area of the school and for whom the school applied for is their nearest community school within the

- 6. Other children from within the catchment area of the school;
- 7. Children living outside of the catchment area with a sibling at the school:
- 8. Children living outside of the catchment area of the school.

In the event of oversubscription within categories 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 (see above), priority will closest to the school by the shortest walking distance. In the event of two distances being the same, a decision will be made. by random allocation.

A digital ordnance survey map is used to measure the distance from the home address to the school's designated official entrance. The distance is measured from the centre point of the address to the centre point of the main entrance of the school, measuring along the centre line of the shortest approved route. The system will take account of local footpaths and public walkways wit regard to the safety of the route. It does not take account of the location of pedestrian crossing points.

Distances measured by other means i.e. private car, pedometer or internet websites are likely to result in different calculations as they may use different parameters for the address locations and the underlying network which is used to calculate the distance, and therefore should not be relied upon as

evidence that the Local Authority's distance calculation is incorrect.


