On Tuesday, we also joined a live assembly led by The Sanctuary Foundation as part of our Black History Month activities. Next week, Iqra in Year 2 will be leading an art project to prepare our submission for the upcoming Festival of Arts in November. We'd love families to collect natural materials such as twigs, pine cones, leaves, and acorns during your walks this week, please bring them in next week.

On Friday 17th October, we'd love to welcome parents into class from 3:00pm for an Afternoon Diwali Tea – a lovely opportunity to come together, share learning, and celebrate this special festival as a community. One parent suggested a hybrid option for future sessions to support those who can't attend in person, a great idea that we're now exploring.

It was also lovely to see such a fantastic turnout for Lorna's Coffee Morning this week. When I popped in, the room was full of energy, conversation, and connection. It's always valuable to hear your feedback, both positive and constructive, and we'll continue to listen and act wherever we can.

Tiger Class have had another wonderfully busy week! The children have been diving into their phonics learning, focusing on the sounds u, b, f, and e-we've been practicing through songs, games and lots of Fred talk throughout our school day. We have also been practising our green word reading using Fred talk! Our autumn activities continued with conker counting and using our senses to notice the seasonal changes around us. Each member of Tiger class has worked incredibly hard this week as we completed our Reception Baseline Assessments. The assessments required lots of thinking and we are very proud of every child's efforts! We have been focusing on the numbers 1, 2 and 3 in Maths this week by representing amounts in different ways including through pictures and objects. We have also practised our number formations and name writing in the mornings. Please continue to work on name writing and number formation with your child at home to build confidence!

REMINDER

EYFS Parents' Phonics Workshop

Tuesday 14th October 9:00am-9:30am

We have had such a exciting week in class as we delved into our story What the Ladybird Heard! The children absolutely loved exploring the tale and getting to know all the characters and the sneaky plan that takes place on the farm. This story has also given us the perfect opportunity to learn more about our sense of hearing, which we have linked to our ongoing topic about the five senses. The children have been exploring how we use our senses every day to help us understand the world around us. They took part in lots of fun listening games and sound hunts, where they had to use their ears carefully to identify different noises both inside and outside the classroom. It was wonderful to see how engaged they were – listening to animal sounds, guessing what was making each noise, and talking about how our ears help us learn new things.

In maths, we've been deepening our understanding of numbers 1–3. The children have been challenged to subitise and compare quantities, justify how they know a group shows a certain number, and spot patterns and differences between sets. They explored how numbers can be represented in many ways – through objects, pictures, and arrangements – strengthening their ability to think flexibly about number and quantity. groups of items in the classroom. We spotted lots of examples, such as 3 pencils in a pot, 3 teddy bears sitting on the shelf, and 2 yellow blocks in the construction area. Through games and hands-on activities, the children are becoming more confident at recognising quantities without counting, and they are starting to understand that numbers are all around us in our everyday environment.

To end our busy week, we had a lovely (and very tasty!) activity – making jam sandwiches. The children really enjoyed the whole process of spreading the butter and jam, carefully putting their sandwiches together, and, of course, eating them! It was a fantastic opportunity for them to develop their fine motor skills and follow simple instructions. The children loved talking about their favourite spreads – jam was definitely the most popular choice, but we also had a few votes for honey and chocolate spread. It was such a fun and memorable way to end a week full of learning, laughter, and lots of new experiences!







Lion Class

In Maths this week, Lion Class have been learning how to use a number line. We have been applying mathematical language such as 'one more', 'one less', 'greatest', 'greater than', and 'less than' to help us find answers. We also learnt how to make jumps forwards and backwards along the number line.

In Geography we have been learning to name and locate the four countries that make up the United Kingdom: England, Scotland, Wales, and Northern Ireland. We used maps to help us locate each country and looked carefully at the different flags. It was great to hear children sharing their knowledge and experiences of different countries.

In Science, we have been learning about the four seasons: autumn, winter, spring, and summer. We explored what happens to trees throughout the year and observed how leaves change colour, fall off, and grow again as the seasons change. We can't wait for our trip next Tuesday to Millwall park, where we will go on a hunt looking for signs of autumn!

We were also treated to an amazing interactive story telling session by Wendy Sheaer as part of our Black History Month learning.



This week in Panda Class has been full of curiosity and discovery! We have been learning all about the seasons, and it has been wonderful to hear the children confidently explain which season we are in and how they can tell. Everyone is looking forward to our trip next Tuesday, where we'll explore the colourful autumn leaves - both on the trees and scattered on the ground.

In Science, the children created beautiful drawings of trees in all four seasons. Their attention to detail and focus were impressive, and each picture showed how carefully they observed the changes in nature. We also had a very special visitor this week - author Wendy Shearer. Her storytelling session was lively and interactive as the children journeyed through the adventures of Anansi the Spider. They explored different animals and settings, sparking lots of imagination and excitement.

In English, we have been practising using full sentences to describe our journey through the classroom. The children have now begun writing these sentences and are eager to finish their work next week. What a wonderful week of learning, creativity, and enthusiasm in Panda Class!




Elephant Class

In Maths, pupils have been working hard to count in 2s, 5s, 10s-and even 3s! Please continue to play counting games at home to support your child's counting fluency and confidence.



In Science, we learned about food chains, discovering the roles of producers, primary consumers, and secondary consumers. The children enjoyed finding out how living things depend on each other for food and survival.

A big thank you to all the grown-ups who joined us for our poetry performance on Friday! The children worked so hard to remember their poem, adding expressive actions and performing with such confidence and enthusiasm. We were so proud of their efforts and delighted to share the experience with you.

What a wonderful week we've had in Year 2! The children have been working hard, showing great curiosity in their learning, and living out our school values every day. This week, we have been focusing on our school value of Respect. Together, we've explored what respect looks like in different situations – whether that's listening carefully when others are speaking, taking care of our classroom resources, or showing kindness on the playground.



In Science, we've been delving into the topic of food chains. The children have learned that all living things are connected and depend on each other to survive. They enjoyed discovering new vocabulary such as producer, primary consumer, and secondary consumer, and had lots of fun creating their own food chain diagrams.

In Maths, we've been practising our 2-, 5-, 10-, and 3-times tables. We especially, had lots of fun learning the 3-times tables through a catchy song inspired by Ed Sheeran's "Azizam." We've also been using number lines and 100 squares to spot patterns in our times tables and to support our understanding of multiplication. The children are beginning to notice how numbers repeat and form patterns, which is helping them become more confident when recalling facts and solving problems.

We'd like to say a huge well done to all the children for their hard work this week. They've shown perseverance, curiosity, and lots of enthusiasm for their learning. Also, a huge thank you to parents and carers for continuing to support their learning at home.



Koala Class

It's been a very busy in Koala Class! The children have done a fantastic job adapting to a week full of change and new experiences. We began the week with an incredible storytelling session from Wendy Shear, who captivated us all with her lively performance and wonderful tales. In English, the children finished their thoughtful poems on the theme of disappointment, exploring the emotion through similes and colour, and expressing their ideas with sensitivity and imagination. We were especially proud of how well they were able to describe such a complex feeling.

Later in the week, we ventured out on our trip to the Soanes Centre with Dimuthu, where we became real-life geologists! The children investigated different types of rocks, explored how everyday objects like roofs and glass are made from natural materials such as slate and sand, and learned how the properties of materials link to their uses. There was lots of new vocabulary, and we were amazed by their curiosity and enthusiasm. We also discovered fascinating facts about sedimentary rocks, fossils, and even how coal is formed and used as a fuel. We finished with a look at Mary Anning and her important fossil discoveries, even linking it to the nursery rhyme "She Sells Sea Shells."

This weekend, children are encouraged to go on a nature walk and collect some colourful leaves and flowers for our art project on Friday. We can't wait to see what they have collected for their project!

Pebbles


Feathers
