Sarah Jane's reflection of the week

What a wonderful week it has been here at Mulberry Wood Wharf Primary, one filled with talent, confidence, and children proudly sharing the skills they have been working so hard to learn. Our value this half term is community, and it has truly shone through in everything we've done.

We started the week with fantastic performances from our young musicians, playing guitar and piano under the expert guidance of Conor and Preesha, our brilliant music tutors. I always tell the children how proud I am of them; learning an instrument is no small feat. It takes discipline, patience, practice, the ability to read music, dexterity, focus, and an ear for rhythm and beat. To then stand up and perform solo in front of an audience takes real courage. Those little nerves and butterflies they feel are part of learning about themselves, they help build confidence for future presentations, public speaking, and stepping out of their comfort zone as they grow.

Another highlight was taking Year 1 and Year 3 to sing Christmas songs outside Waitrose. They were absolutely amazing and a true delight to watch. Members of the public stopped, listened in awe, and commented on how beautifully they sang and how well-behaved they were. We also used this as an opportunity to collect donations from the public, all of which will go towards essential educational items, school trips, after-school clubs, author visits, and enriching experiences for our children.

And speaking of Waitrose—don't forget that Mulberry Wood Wharf is featured in their Community Matters green token scheme this month. If you're passing through, please pop a green token into our box. If we receive the most tokens, Waitrose will make a generous donation to the school, again supporting essential items and experiences for our pupils.

Next week, I'll be taking Year 2 to sing at North Colonnade, another lovely opportunity for our children to be out and about, connecting with the wider community.

Our Advent Calendar is now live on our website. Each day you can open a door to find a festive surprise, do have a look!

Next week is also Assessment Week at Wood Wharf. Across all year groups, children will complete assessments in a range of subjects so we can see the progress they have made since September. I will review the data closely, and alongside our subject leads, we will carry out detailed analysis. This informs our planning for January and ensures teaching is responsive and purposeful. These assessments feed directly into Pupil Progress Meetings at the start of January. Leaders meet with class teachers to review targets set earlier in the year and to set new ones. We look carefully at children working at greater depth, those working at the expected level, and those working towards it. We think about how to stretch and challenge children, and where we need quick, targeted measures to support progress. It's important to highlight that greater depth is not about racing ahead in the curriculum, it's about developing deeper thinking, applying knowledge in different contexts, and showing a breadth and richness of understanding.

We are also incredibly excited for the Reception Nativity next week—and I'll give you a clue... it's wriggly! You are certainly in for a treat. Every Reception cohort performs a nativity each year. Not only does it support their understanding of the Christmas story, but it also links to our value of community as we celebrate and learn about one another's traditions. The children explore how different religious festivals are connected and why these celebrations take place.

Tiger Class



This week in Tiger Class, we've had so much fun exploring the classic tale of The Three Little Pigs! The children enjoyed listening to the story and retelling it using puppets and role play, which really brought the characters to life. We built houses out of different materials—straw, sticks, and bricks—and tested which ones were the strongest against the "Big Bad Wolf". Through this, the children learned about materials, problem-solving, and teamwork. We also practiced sequencing the story and used lots of rich language to describe what happened.



In Maths, we have been focusing on consolidating our understanding of numbers 1-5 through different song and nursery rhymes. We were very impressed with the children's big write pieces this week, retelling the story of The Three Little Pigs and demonstrating their growing phonics knowledge. The children have also been working hard in our Nativity rehearsals – we can't wait to welcome you as the audience on the morning of Wednesday 10th! It's been a fantastic week full of creativity and learning!

Lion Class



Festivities are in full swing at Mulberry Wood Wharf! Lion Class joined by some of the Koala Class children, kicked off the week with beautiful carol singing outside Waitrose in Canary Wharf. The children were incredibly brave, performing in such a busy public space. In English, Lion Class have been planning their own stories inspired by We're Going to Find the Monster. Just as the story uses imagination to transform ordinary places into magical lands, we did the same in our lessons. The children created three magical lands of their own and carefully labelled each one. We also planned what our mysterious creature will be and how the story will end. Next week, we can't wait to start writing our stories.

In Maths Lion Class has been learning all about 2D and 3D shapes this week. We explored how many edges and corners different 2D shapes have and compared them with each other. We also learnt the names of 3D shape names, identifying their faces and discussing how these shapes are used in the world around us.

Panda Class

We are now five weeks into this half term, and Panda Class has had another wonderful week of learning and celebration! One of our highlights was the Christmas sing along, where the children truly shone. I was so proud to see them exude confidence, enthusiasm, and joy as they performed. They represented MWW beautifully, and it was lovely to witness their hard work and excitement come together in such a festive way.

In Maths, the children have been exploring geometry, focusing on both 2D and 3D shapes. They have enjoyed creating patterns, sorting shapes, and spotting them in the world around us. It has been fantastic to see how quickly they are making connections - eagerly pointing out cylinders, cuboids, spheres, cubes, cones, and pyramids whenever they appear during our day.

In History, we have been comparing shops from the past with those we see today. The children discussed differences in size, location, and payment methods, and they drew on their own experiences to make thoughtful comparisons. Their insights sparked great conversations and helped deepen their understanding of how life has changed over time.

Year 2 have had a fantastic week diving into the fascinating topic of the Great Fire of London. We explored the reasons why the fire spread so quickly, discovered how historians have been able to learn about the events of 1666, and found out how the fire was finally put out. We also compared fire-fighting then and now, learning how the fire service has changed since the Great Fire.



In maths, pupils have begun investigating 2D and 3D shapes. We have been counting sides and vertices, naming common shapes, and recognising them in the world around us.



Throughout the week, we've also been warming up our vocal cords as we practise for our Christmas carolling on Thursday 11th and our Christmas Show on Friday 12th. We look forward to seeing you there!

Penguin Class



We have had a wonderfully busy and creative week in Year 2, and the children should feel very proud of everything they've achieved!

This week, the children completed writing their very own versions of The Magic Paintbrush. We were so impressed by the imaginative ideas, exciting twists, and thoughtful descriptions that they included in their stories. Some children even went a step further and created their own characters using a range of creative materials. Their designs were fantastic and showed real enthusiasm and inventiveness – well done, everyone!



In Maths, we began our brand-new Shape unit. The children explored both 2D and 3D shapes, identifying their features and using mathematical vocabulary such as sides, vertices, edges, and faces. They enjoyed handling real objects, spotting shapes around the classroom, and discussing what makes each shape unique.



In Science, we continued learning about how different animals survive by exploring the ways their bodies are suited to their habitats. We compared lungs and gills, thinking about why some animals need to breathe air while others can take in oxygen from water. We also looked at how animals get the water they need, discussing the difference between those that drink and those that absorb moisture through their skin. Finally, we learned about different types of eaters, including herbivores, carnivores, and omnivores, and how their diets help them stay healthy and alive. The children asked brilliant questions and showed a fantastic understanding of how animals have exactly what they need to survive.

A huge well done to all the children who took part in the music and dance performances this week. They represented Penguin Class beautifully with their confidence, teamwork, and enthusiasm. We are incredibly proud of them!

Koala Class

What a wonderful and productive week we've had! The children have been working hard across all subjects and showing great enthusiasm for their learning.

Excitement is building as the children continue rehearsing for their Christmas performances. They've been practising their lines, songs, and actions with growing confidence. We can't wait for you to see all their hard work come together!

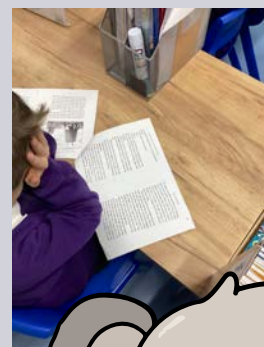
We also enjoyed watching different music performances in school this week. The children loved exploring how musicians use sound and expression to bring their pieces to life.

In English, we have been developing vocabulary inspired by Iron Man by Ted Hughes. The children explored descriptive language connected to the scrapyard setting, using powerful adjectives and imaginative phrases to enhance their writing.

Whilst in maths, our focus has been on recognising and using multiples of 3 and 4. The children practised identifying number patterns and applying them to solve problems.

In science, we learned about different types of skeletons and compared vertebrates and invertebrates. The children were curious, engaged, and eager to explore how animal bodies are structured.

It has truly been a very good week full of energy, enthusiasm, and excellent learning. Well done to all the children!
