



On Wednesday, Lion Class went to the Soanes Centre and took part in an exciting science workshop to consolidate their learning on materials. We explored and talked about a range of objects and what they were made from. We discovered that when two stones are rubbed together they can create a magical spark! We then headed out to explore the outdoor area. The children were tasked with collecting some sticks which was used to stoke a fire. We learnt that as the sticks burned, the heat changes it into charcoal. The children showed great resilience as we made our way back to school, carrying with them a wonderful new learning experience. A busy week ended with the KS1 sing-along, where Lion Class performed a Christmas poem. It was fantastic to see so many children confidently performing in front of a big audience, joyfully remembering all the words and actions. A very big well done!

Panda Class

This week in Panda Class, we enjoyed a fantastic visit to the Soanes Centre for a hands on materials workshop. The children were eager to share what they know about different materials, and the facilitator was so impressed by their ability to explain and distinguish between them with such confidence. It was wonderful to see their learning come to life in a real world setting. During the workshop, the children also had the opportunity to collect sticks and take part in a fire making and charcoal making activity. The children were engaged, curious, and enthusiastic as they explored each step of the process. We were very fortunate to have several parent volunteers join us. Your presence contributed to a smooth, safe, and enjoyable experience for everyone.



In English, we are now coming to the end of our topic, and the children have been working exceptionally hard on their own story plans.
