Sarah Jane's Reflection of the Week

Welcome back to the Spring 2 term!

Wow, what a treat we have had this week! We have been blessed with what feels like a glimpse into summer, and dry weather too!! Brighter days and lighter nights just breathe positivity into our school community. The sunshine has certainly lifted spirits, and it has been wonderful to see the children enjoying the playground in the dry weather.

I would also like to send warm wishes from all of us at school to our families who are observing Ramadan at this special time. We wish you peace, reflection and togetherness, and we thank you for sharing such an important part of your lives and faith with our community. This week it has been wonderful to spend time with our Rights Ambassadors as they relaunch our school rights:

- The right to learn
- The right to be safe
- The right to be heard
- The right to play
- The right to be healthy

We spoke together about how rights and responsibilities go hand in hand.

For example:

We all have the right to learn, but we also have the responsibility to let others learn by listening carefully and not disrupting lessons.

We have the right to be safe, and the responsibility to make safe choices and use kind hands and words.

We have the right to be heard, and the responsibility to listen respectfully when others are speaking.

We have the right to play, and the responsibility to include others and play fairly.

We have the right to be healthy, and the responsibility to make positive choices about food, rest, exercise and hygiene.

Understanding this balance helps our children grow into thoughtful, fair and respectful members of our community – and that takes resilience too. Sometimes doing the right thing, even when it feels tricky, is what builds strong character.

★ Star Writer Award

This week we introduced our new Star Writer Award!

Every Friday, teachers will choose one child from each class to come and spend time with me to share their writing and tell me what they are proud of. It does not have to be a finished piece – it might be a target they have been working on, such as using full stops correctly or improving handwriting. It may also be a published piece that has been carefully edited and improved. The children's names will be mentioned in our weekly newsletter, and I am very much looking forward to celebrating their progress, effort and pride in their learning.

★ Highlights of the Week

There have been so many special moments already this term. We started the week with a whole school INSET day, joining colleagues from other E14 schools for a full day of workshops centred around Inclusion. The feedback from staff was extremely positive. Not only is it valuable to connect and collaborate with professionals from other settings, but high-quality training means we can implement new learning instantly into our classrooms, directly benefiting the children.

Ria invited me to watch her LAMDA performance ahead of her exam this Saturday. Ria, good luck, and thank you for trusting me to help you prepare. We are all very proud of you!

I had the pleasure of joining Blue Whale Class in the sports hall this week and watching them have so much fun with Coach Tom. The energy, teamwork and determination on display were fantastic. It was wonderful to see the children challenging themselves, encouraging one another and embracing physical activity with such enthusiasm, a brilliant example of our right to play and our right to be healthy in action.

I also put out some new equipment in the playground this week and was particularly proud of Idris (Year 2) and Adaam (Year 3) for playing so beautifully together with the target/hoop game. They demonstrated shared and fair play and set a wonderful example for others.

We ended the week with the most wonderful Friday assembly, led beautifully by Frederick and Sophie in Year 3, who shared the tradition of Mărțișor from Romania and Baba Marta, which is also celebrated in Germany and other European countries on 1st March. They explained how this tradition marks the beginning of spring, symbolising new life, hope and good fortune. Traditionally, red and white string bracelets are worn to represent health and happiness as the seasons change.

Their presentation was thoughtful, interactive and incredibly engaging. The traditional dress and music made it even more immersive for us all. What truly touched us was how Frederick and Sophie, alongside their parents, had made enough Mărțișor strings so that every child and adult in the school could have one.

That generosity and pride in sharing their culture is exactly the community we want to continue building here at Mulberry Wood Wharf, one where we share our experiences, journeys and traditions, and where everyone feels they belong and are valued.

Nature Learning at MWW

Nature, Wellbeing and Learning at Mulberry Wood Wharf

At Mulberry Wood Wharf, we are deeply committed to supporting children's mental health and wellbeing, and we know that time spent outdoors and connected to nature plays a powerful role in this.

Across the school, we are developing a thoughtful approach to nature-based learning, led by Marwah, which looks at how we can meaningfully weave nature into children's everyday experiences. This includes exploring how our playground spaces can be developed to include more natural elements, as well as how we can, over time, make mindful use of the rich outdoor environments that surround our school community.

Nature-based learning supports children to slow down, notice the world around them, build resilience and curiosity, and develop a sense of care for their environment. Outdoor experiences also lend themselves naturally to cross-curricular learning, encouraging observation, creativity, questioning, collaboration and reflection.

As part of Children's Mental Health Week, we also want to inspire families to tap into the benefits of nature beyond school. Simple experiences such as walks, noticing seasonal changes, visiting green spaces, or spending time outdoors together can have a hugely positive impact on children's wellbeing. We will be sharing resources and ideas to support this, so families can explore what works best for them.

This is an area of work we are excited to continue developing carefully and purposefully, and we look forward to sharing more as our nature-based learning offer grows.

Tiger Class



Tiger Class have had a fantastic first week back after half-term! The children returned to school full of smiles and enthusiasm, settling quickly back into routines and reconnecting with their friends.

We have been making the most of the sunny weather by taking our learning outdoors, enjoying time in the water tray, and exploring through play in the fresh air. Our focus story this week has been The Gingerbread Man, and the children have loved retelling the tale, acting it out, and joining in with the repeated phrase, "Run, run, as fast as you can!"



They have also enjoyed creative activities linked to the story, including decorating their own gingerbread characters and thinking about how to help the Gingerbread Man cross the river safely. Well done, Tiger Class, for such a super start to the new half-term!

Blue Whale Class



The children have had a lovely first week back, immersing themselves in learning about The Gingerbread Man. They were introduced to the story, took part in role-playing activities to bring it to life, and confidently retold the tale during their Big Write.

They have also begun practising for their upcoming show, The Gingerbread Man. It has been wonderful to see how their familiarity with the story is supporting rehearsals—because they know the sequence of events so well, they are able to anticipate what happens next and perform with growing confidence.

In Maths, the children have been focusing on the numbers 9 and 10. They have been exploring number bonds to 9 and 10, identifying whether these numbers are odd or even, and practising subitising to recognise quantities quickly without counting. The children have also been searching for and creating groups of 9 and 10 both in the classroom and in our outdoor learning space. We are looking forward to extending their learning as we move beyond 10.

Lastly, in Art, the children have been busy designing and creating their own gingerbread man puppets. They have shown great creativity in their designs, and we are excited to see the finished results, which will be made from felt fabric.



Lion Class

Welcome back, we hope you all had a wonderful half term.



This week in English, we learnt what a lighthouse was through careful observation of pictures, watching videos, and reading an information text. We then linked our new knowledge to the front cover of our new book 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch' by Ronda Armitage. Using the title and illustration as clues, the children made thoughtful predictions about what the story might be about. As we began reading, we paused to make further predictions and wrote fantastic sentences about what might be inside Mr Grinling's basket. The children were excited to discover that it was filled with delicious food and enjoyed sharing their own favourites. After finishing the story, the children wrote about their favourite part. We are extremely proud of how well children are using their phonetic knowledge to write independent super sentences!



In History we learnt about a significant figure from the past. Her name was Mary Anning. We learnt that she was a Paleontologist- someone who found and learnt about fossils. Lion class were amazed to see pictures of fossils and learnt that they were parts of plants and animals that lived a long time ago and have turned into hard rocks. We will be creating our own fossils using clay, how exciting!



Panda Class

We've had a wonderful week welcoming back the children, and we couldn't be happier with the lovely warmer weather that has made everything feel so much livelier! It's been a week filled with excitement and lots of fun. One of the highlights for me has been getting involved during playtime - joining in on games like tag and hide and seek with the children. It's been a great opportunity to encourage positive play, teamwork, and how to include everyone in the fun. It's been a blast watching how quickly they run, and their energy has been contagious!

In our Maths lessons this week, the children have been exploring the concept of measurements, particularly focusing on terms like "full," "empty," "nearly empty," and "nearly full." We also delved into the difference between capacity and volume, using real-life examples to make these concepts clearer. Next week, we'll be expanding our learning to numbers within 50. If you have time for home learning, it would be wonderful if the children could practice counting up to 50, both forwards and backwards. Additionally, understanding the place value of numbers is key. For example, 32 consists of 3 tens and 2 ones, while 48 has 4 tens and 8 ones.

Looking ahead, the children will be going on a library trip on March 11th. If you haven't already, please ensure that consent is submitted via Arbor as soon as possible so that we can finalise the details and continue with the planning. The children can't wait for the trip, and we're excited to see them dive into the world of books and all the stories waiting to be explored!

Thank you for your ongoing support, and we wish you all a wonderful weekend ahead.



Elephant Class

It has been a fantastic first week back at school, with pupils excited and eager to begin their learning for this half term. Although this half term may be a shorter one, the learning opportunities ahead are truly endless. Pupils quickly settled back into familiar routines and it was wonderful to see friendships rekindled and sparkling once again in class and on the playground.



This week, pupils have enjoyed starting a new reading text for their reading sessions, *The Street Beneath My Feet*, this engaging non-fiction picture book is written by Charlotte Guillain and illustrated by Yuval Zommer. The book's unique fold-out pages create an exciting, immersive reading experience, allowing pupils to explore the seven layers of the Earth. Pupils have been practising their retrieval skills and answering retrieval questions to deepen their understanding of the text.



In mathematics, pupils have been practising multiplying and dividing in 5s and 10s. Most pupils have gained confidence in using related multiplication and division facts, and they have applied their maths knowledge to solve two-step word problems.

Please do look out for our curriculum letter, which has been sent out and contains important information about what your child will be learning this half term, home project details and important dates.




Penguin Class



It has been so lovely to see all the children back in school after a well-deserved rest! They have returned ready to learn with great listening, participation and focus.



In Maths, the children have been learning their 5- and 10-times tables and exploring how multiplication and division are linked. They have been practising counting in 5s and 10s, solving multiplication sentences, and learning how to divide by 5 and 10 by sharing into equal groups. The children are becoming much more confident in spotting patterns in these times tables and explaining how they know their answers.



In History, we have started our brand-new topic on the History of the London Docklands. This week, the children focused on exploring what the Docklands are like today. They looked at how the area has changed over time and discussed the modern buildings, businesses, and transport links now found there. The children asked thoughtful questions and are excited to learn how the Docklands have developed throughout history.

In PE, the children have begun learning how to play football. They practised key skills such as dribbling, passing, and controlling the ball with their feet. It was wonderful to see their teamwork, determination, and sportsmanship as they encouraged one another and tried their best during activities.

We are very proud of how positively the children have started this half term.



Koala Class



It has been a fantastic week in class, and the children have shown great resilience as they returned and settled back into their learning routines.

In Maths, the children have been exploring mass (kg and g). They have been learning how to compare different weights, find equivalent masses, and develop a stronger understanding of measurement. The children have worked carefully and shown excellent problem-solving skills.

In History, we have been learning about the Roman Army and how their strategies helped the Roman Empire grow. The children asked thoughtful and insightful questions, demonstrating a strong understanding of why strategy and tactics were so important during the Roman era. Their engagement and curiosity have been impressive.

In English, we introduced our new book *The Great Chocoplot* with a fun and exciting hook, the "chocolate shortage"! (Don't worry, it wasn't real!) The children created imaginative posters to highlight the shortage, showing creativity and enthusiasm for their learning.

In Science, we began our new unit on plants. The children recapped their previous knowledge and explored the different parts of a plant, understanding their functions and why each part is important. We discussed how the loss of one part can affect the whole plant, deepening their understanding of plant life.

It has been absolutely lovely to be back after the half term break and to see all of your smiling faces again - we have really missed you! The children have returned with such enthusiasm and positivity, and it has been wonderful to see everyone ready to learn.




