## Sarah Jane's Reflection of the Week

This week began with an assembly centred around our value of the week: being active, both in our bodies and our minds. We linked this to one of our school rights, the right to play, and talked about how play should always be safe, respectful and inclusive. We also reminded the children that with rights come responsibilities. Our Rights Ambassadors did a fantastic job modelling how to use the playground equipment safely and respectfully so that everyone can enjoy playtime together.

We also took time this week to learn about Holi, the vibrant Hindu festival often known as the Festival of Colours. Holi celebrates the arrival of spring, new beginnings, and the triumph of good over evil. It is a joyful time when families and communities come together, often marking the occasion by throwing coloured powders, sharing food and celebrating with music and dancing. I know that many of our families will be celebrating this weekend, and we send you our warmest wishes for a joyful and colourful Holi celebration.

I also had the pleasure of accompanying Year 3 to a wonderful set of workshops hosted by the Canary Wharf Group as part of our World Book Day celebrations. The children took part in a landmark hunt using their impressive model-scale version of Canary Wharf, read a book called *The Train That Can*, designed their own bookmarks and even built buildings out of Lego. It was a brilliant mix of creativity, imagination and learning. During the visit we met Shobi Khan, the CEO of Canary Wharf Group, who is always so positive about involving and supporting the school. The children asked such thoughtful questions about how he became a CEO and how long it has taken for Canary Wharf to develop. Some of our pupils even chatted with him about their time in the United States, where he is from, which made the conversation feel especially purposeful and inspiring. Sitting together in a boardroom overlooking Canary Wharf and the wider London skyline suddenly made the whole experience feel very grown up! My thanks also go to Serina and Emma from the Canary Wharf Community team, as well as Ian, one of our governors, who joined us and helped make the visit so memorable.

Back at school, World Book Day itself was a brilliant celebration of reading. It was wonderful to see the creativity and effort that went into the costumes and how much fun the children had. The catwalk was a real highlight! The teachers had a team theme and recommended that I come dressed as Little Miss Bossy, while they all dressed up as other characters from the series, which made for a very colourful staff line-up!

On a more serious note, World Book Day is always a good reminder of just how important reading is. Even with busy schedules, carving out time to read with your children each day can make such a difference. Sharing stories together builds imagination, language and confidence, but it also creates precious moments together. Honesty alert! My own little one recently went through a phase where she wasn't engaging with books (how can that happen to a headteacher?!). Someone kindly gave her a chapter book for her birthday, and we started reading a chapter together just before bed. There are a few pictures, but she absolutely loved using her imagination to build the story in her mind. It sparked some lovely conversations between us and I was very relieved that we seem to be back on track! I now try to protect that special reading time with her most evenings, I know first-hand how easy it is for busy schedules to get in the way.

Next week we continue our celebration of reading with an author visit on Wednesday, as well as a cosy pyjama dress-up day so children can enjoy stories in comfort. It is also British Science Week, and we are looking forward to seeing the creativity of our budding inventors, so calling all ideas and inventions! We have several exciting activities planned, including online workshops (one on robotics and AI which looks great fun) and a practical STEM afternoon. A big thank you to the parents who have volunteered to come in next Friday to talk to the children about their careers in science.

Finally, as we continue thinking about our value of being active, I'll leave you with a simple thought for the children:

"A healthy mind lives in an active body - move, play, explore and keep your curiosity growing."

Have a lovely weekend everyone. I'm hoping for some sunshine as I attempt a big parenting milestone, taking the stabilisers off my little one's bike and finding a big patch of grass to practise on. Wish me luck!

# Nature Learning at MWW

Nature, Wellbeing and Learning at Mulberry Wood Wharf

At Mulberry Wood Wharf, we are deeply committed to supporting children's mental health and wellbeing, and we know that time spent outdoors and connected to nature plays a powerful role in this.

Across the school, we are developing a thoughtful approach to nature-based learning, led by Marwah, which looks at how we can meaningfully weave nature into children's everyday experiences. This includes exploring how our playground spaces can be developed to include more natural elements, as well as how we can, over time, make mindful use of the rich outdoor environments that surround our school community.

Nature-based learning supports children to slow down, notice the world around them, build resilience and curiosity, and develop a sense of care for their environment. Outdoor experiences also lend themselves naturally to cross-curricular learning, encouraging observation, creativity, questioning, collaboration and reflection.

As part of Children's Mental Health Week, we also want to inspire families to tap into the benefits of nature beyond school. Simple experiences such as walks, noticing seasonal changes, visiting green spaces, or spending time outdoors together can have a hugely positive impact on children's wellbeing. We will be sharing resources and ideas to support this, so families can explore what works best for them.

This is an area of work we are excited to continue developing carefully and purposefully, and we look forward to sharing more as our nature-based learning offer grows.

# Tiger Class



Tiger Class had a busy and exciting time this week! The children enjoyed learning about the festival of Holi, discovering why it is celebrated and talking about the bright colours people use during the celebrations.



They also worked hard on their writing by creating a recipe for how to make a delicious gingerbread man, carefully thinking about the ingredients and steps needed.

The children have started learning in their new phonics groups for this term and we are so impressed with their effort and commitment!

In our Arts and Crafts area, we have had a go at starting to make our Gingerbread man puppets. It's a tricky process but fun! We have been enthusiastically practising for our upcoming performance of The Gingerbread Man, working hard to perfect our singing and actions. We are so excited to show you!

# Blue Whale Class



This week in Reception, the children have been enjoying the story of The Gingerbread Man, focusing on the part where the little old man and the little old woman baked their gingerbread man. Blue Whale Class had some wonderful discussions about what ingredients we would need to make our own gingerbread man and how we bake it.



Together, we explored all the ingredients needed, such as flour, sugar, butter, eggs and ginger, and worked collaboratively to create our own class recipe. The children then independently wrote their own step-by-step instructions, remembering to include a list of ingredients. We have been working really hard on using capital letters at the beginning of sentences, finger spaces between our words, and full stops at the end of our sentences. We are so proud of the progress the children are making in their writing!



In Maths, the children have been learning about compositions to 10 and beyond. They have been using numicon blocks to represent numbers and exploring different ways to make numbers by combining smaller amounts. The children enjoyed practically building numbers and working out the different compositions using their blocks.

Lastly, we are very excited to share that the children have been busy preparing our classroom for some very special visitors on Monday. We have ducklings coming to stay with Reception! The children are incredibly excited and have been making beautiful welcome cards for our new little friends. We are looking forward to welcoming parents and carers soon to come and see the ducklings with us.



# Lion Class



This week we started our new science topic based on Animals. We learnt that an animal is a living thing. Animals move freely, need water and food. We then looked at 'fish' as our first group of animals, learning some key features of fish. Yagna said "they lay eggs," Sudiksha added "they breathe through their gills" and Fatima recalled they are "cold blooded." Next week we will look at two more groups of animals and describe their features.

Our History learning continued as we explored the specific discoveries made by Mary Anning. We learned that two of the important fossils she discovered were an ichthyosaur and a plesiosaur. These were sea creatures that lived a long time ago. Nami Kaia learnt and recalled that "it took 5 months to take out the (ichthyosaur) fossil." Lion Class have been so immersed in their History learning, asking questions, listening attentively, sharing their own ideas and showing great curiosity- just like Mary Anning!

As the week came to an end, it was lovely to have children dressed as part of our world book day celebrations. We love hearing about childrens favourite stories and characters. Books are an incredible gateway to many key skills including language, communication and imagination. We are already looking forward to our cosy reading session next week!





# Panda Class

The children have been working hard and showing great enthusiasm in their learning.

In DT, the children explored the skill of paper weaving. They began by planning their designs and discussing different patterns they could create. The children worked wonderfully as a team, supporting one another as they carefully wove strips of paper together. This activity helped develop their fine motor skills, patience, and creativity. By the end of the lesson, the children were very proud to see their finished woven pieces and enjoyed sharing their final products with their classmates.

In PSHE, our focus this week was on making healthy and safe choices. The children had thoughtful discussions about items we may find around the home and learned to identify which household products are safe and unsafe to be around. We talked about the importance of asking an adult for help and why some products should only be used by grown-ups. The children were very sensible during these conversations and showed a good understanding of how to keep themselves safe.

A quick reminder that I have sent an email regarding Wednesday 11th March 2026. On this day, we will no longer be visiting the library because it will be Cosy Read Day in school. Children are invited to come to school wearing their pyjamas and enjoy a day filled with reading and relaxing with books.



# Elephant Class

Elephant class have had a wonderful, story-filled week as we began our celebrations for World Book Day! We were delighted to take part in an online author event with the British Library where the brilliant Michael Rosen joined us to share some of his favourite food stories. The children loved listening to him perform his famous poem Chocolate Cake, and they enthusiastically joined in with a fun draw-along activity too. Inspired by the session, pupils later created their own short stories, showing great imagination and creativity.



In English, we also enjoyed retelling an Aesop's Fable. The children worked incredibly hard to include expanded noun phrases in their writing, producing some fantastic descriptive sentences. I am also pleased to see improves in handwriting from lots of children.

In Art, pupils explored colour and texture by creating bold and bright collages inspired by the artist Katie Vernon. Their artwork was full of creativity and personality, and they thoroughly enjoyed experimenting with different materials.

We finished the week with our joyful World Book Day celebrations. I am so proud of the amazing costumes, the enthusiasm for books, and the excitement that reading brings to our classroom. Thank you for all your effort in helping your child dress up in such fun and creative outfits—it truly made the day extra special! Miss Strong enjoyed her day very much too!



# Penguin Class



The children have continued to show great focus and curiosity in their learning this week, and it has been lovely to see their confidence grow across different subjects.

In English, the children have been learning about different word classes, including nouns, verbs, adjectives, and adverbs. They have been practising identifying these in sentences and thinking about how they help make writing more interesting and descriptive. This learning will help prepare the children for their upcoming writing task, where they will be retelling the Aesop fable The Sun and the Wind. The children have already enjoyed discussing the story and thinking about how they can use these word types to improve their writing.



In Maths, we have been exploring length and height. The children have been measuring and comparing different objects using rulers and other measuring tools. They have also been using vocabulary such as longer, shorter, taller, and shorter to describe and compare measurements.

In History, the children have been learning about what the London Docklands looked like in the past. They explored historical images and discussed how the area was once full of busy docks, ships, and warehouses used for trading goods. The children enjoyed spotting the differences between the Docklands then and now and are beginning to understand how much the area has changed over time.

Well done to Penguins for their continued effort and enthusiasm in their learning this week!



# Koala Class

What a fantastic and busy week we have had in Koala class!

At the start of the week in English, the children had an amazing Zoom session with Michael Rosen. He shared stories about magic foods and explored a range of cultural stories linked to food, which really inspired the children. After this, the class began writing the opening of their own narratives, describing a delicious food in their story and using exciting vocabulary to make their writing engaging for the reader.

In Maths, the children have been learning about millilitres (ml) and litres (l) and how these measurements are linked. They worked hard to apply their understanding of number lines to measure and compare different amounts of liquid. It was great to see them building on their previous learning and explaining their thinking.

During RE, we had a really thoughtful conversation about why people pray. The children shared their ideas and discussed how prayer is important in different religions. It was wonderful to hear such respectful and reflective discussions from the class.

World Book Day was a real highlight this week! The children came to school in fantastic costumes and we also enjoyed a trip to Canary Wharf as part of the celebrations. The children had the opportunity to explore different book-themed activities and celebrate their love of reading together.

In Science, the class explored different types of plants and discussed how habitats influence plant adaptations. For example, they learned that a cactus can survive with very little water in dry environments, while plants such as ivy need more water to grow well.

It has been such a lovely, busy week of learning, and we are very proud of all the effort the children have shown.



## LORNA'S UPDATE



This week has been a celebration of reading, creativity and the fantastic effort our children bring to school each day.

It has been wonderful to celebrate World Book Day and see the fantastic effort put into costumes. The excitement around books has been infectious! Reading remains at the heart of our school priorities. As it is our first lesson every morning, being on time is essential. Those early moments are crucial for children's progress across all subjects, as strong reading skills underpin learning across the curriculum.

Behind the scenes, we are reviewing and refreshing our English curriculum to ensure our text choices reflect the very best of children's literature today, alongside the timeless classics that every child should experience. We want our pupils to engage with high quality, contemporary authors while also developing an appreciation of stories that have stood the test of time. By carefully selecting and updating our core texts, we are ensuring a broad, ambitious and inspiring reading journey for every year group. Our aim is for the curriculum to be both a mirror and a window: reflecting our children's own experiences while opening their eyes to new worlds and perspectives.

In classrooms, I have been especially impressed by the beautiful handwriting in Year 3 Koala class, particularly Frederick, whose presentation really stood out this week. Reception are also busy preparing for their gingerbread show. I have heard a few snippets and the singing is sounding wonderful. I cannot wait to see the finished performance.

Finally, a special shout out to Tiger class for 99% attendance! Thank you for your continued support in ensuring children attend regularly and arrive promptly, ready to learn.


