Sarah Jane's Reflection of the Week

This week our school value has been Respect, and it has woven its way through so many of the experiences the children have enjoyed across the school.

We began the week with an assembly marking International Women's Day, which took place on 8th March. With the children, we talked about what this day means in ways that make sense for them, thinking about rights, fairness and equality, and how everyone deserves to be treated with respect and given the same opportunities. These are big ideas, but they are important ones as children begin to make sense of the world they are growing up in and the role they can play in shaping it.

Our learning about looking after ourselves continued when NHS dental students visited the school to lead workshops on dental hygiene. The children learned about how to care for their teeth by thinking about the food and drinks they have and the importance of brushing twice a day, every day. It was a lively and engaging session and a great reminder that respecting ourselves also means looking after our health.

I particularly enjoyed spending time in Year 2 this week practising my French with them alongside Thom, our French teacher from Mulberry London Dock. We were learning how to describe someone and talking about sports, before practising sentences such as "J'aime le tennis." This then led nicely into the Year 2 tennis lesson, which I had great fun joining, it was wonderful to see their enthusiasm and energy on the court.

In Reception, I have been completely mesmerised by the duck eggs that arrived in class this week. We have all been waiting in anticipation for them to hatch! The experience has generated some brilliant questions and rich language among the children. There is something truly magical about children learning about the life cycle of a duck by witnessing it unfold right in front of them.

It has also been British Science Week, and I have been blown away by the incredible inventions children have been bringing in. We clearly have some fantastic young scientists in our school. I loved Valentino's "Colour Launcher", which turns stormy grey skies into bright colours, even the rain comes out colourful! Idris's "Kindness Glasses" were equally brilliant: when you wear them you see kindness everywhere you go. And Kanika's solar-powered windmill was extremely impressive too. What creativity and imagination! Do make sure you read more about these inventions later in the newsletter.

A huge thank you as well to the parents who came in to share their careers with the children as part of Science Week: Everett's dad (medical science), Aila's mum (artificial intelligence and medical science), Yagna's mum (architect) and Juliet's dad (transplant surgeon). Hearing directly from parents about the wide range of careers in science is incredibly inspiring for children and helps them see what might be possible for their own futures.

As part of our Year of Reading, we held a wonderful Cosy Reading Day this week. Children came to school in their pyjamas and spent time reading in a special cosy reading space set up by Shireena and the team, where they could relax and read however they felt most comfortable. This was followed by a visit from author Lucy Noguera, who spoke to the children about her books and writing. Later in the day we held a lovely Meet the Author session after school for families.

Some of our children were also invited to attend the opening of the Idea Store Canary Wharf, and it was a privilege to be part of such a special local event. Do make sure you check out this wonderful community resource, it's a fantastic place for families to explore books, learning and activities together.

Looking ahead to next week, Eid is expected to fall on either Thursday or Friday. School will be closed on the day that Eid falls, and we will keep families informed from Wednesday afternoon/evening onwards, once the date is confirmed. Please do check Arbor for updates and support each other in sharing the information so that everyone feels well informed. We would also like to take this opportunity to wish all families observing Ramadan well. It has been lovely hearing children talk about the family iftars they have been enjoying, a truly special time.

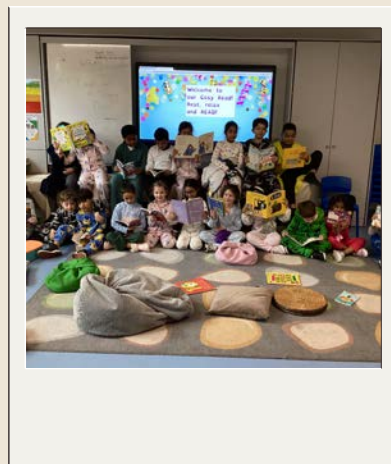

Sharmila -

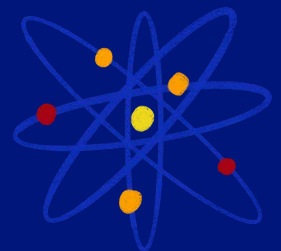
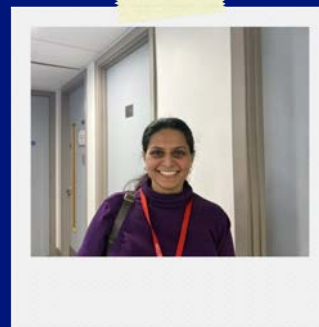
Architect

Nature Learning at MWW

Nature, Wellbeing and Learning at Mulberry Wood Wharf

At Mulberry Wood Wharf, we are deeply committed to supporting children's mental health and wellbeing, and we know that time spent outdoors and connected to nature plays a powerful role in this.

Across the school, we are developing a thoughtful approach to nature-based learning, led by Marwah, which looks at how we can meaningfully weave nature into children's everyday experiences. This includes exploring how our playground spaces can be developed to include more natural elements, as well as how we can, over time, make mindful use of the rich outdoor environments that surround our school community.

Nature-based learning supports children to slow down, notice the world around them, build resilience and curiosity, and develop a sense of care for their environment. Outdoor experiences also lend themselves naturally to cross-curricular learning, encouraging observation, creativity, questioning, collaboration and reflection.

As part of Children's Mental Health Week, we also want to inspire families to tap into the benefits of nature beyond school. Simple experiences such as walks, noticing seasonal changes, visiting green spaces, or spending time outdoors together can have a hugely positive impact on children's wellbeing. We will be sharing resources and ideas to support this, so families can explore what works best for them.

This is an area of work we are excited to continue developing carefully and purposefully, and we look forward to sharing more as our nature-based learning offer grows.

Panda Class

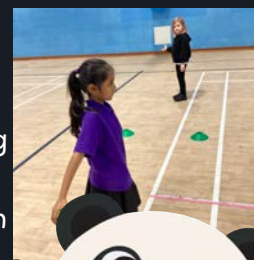
This week has been another busy and activity-filled one in our classroom!

They have been working hard to include these sentence types to make their writing more varied and engaging. They have all planned and are ready to produce their Plastics pollution posters to inform their readers about the impact plastic is having on our world.

We ended our week by celebrating British Science Week by welcoming parents who work in field of STEM. Pupils were engaged in their discussion and asked thoughtful questions.



Penguin Class

This week has been full of exciting events and special experiences for the children, alongside their usual learning in the classroom.

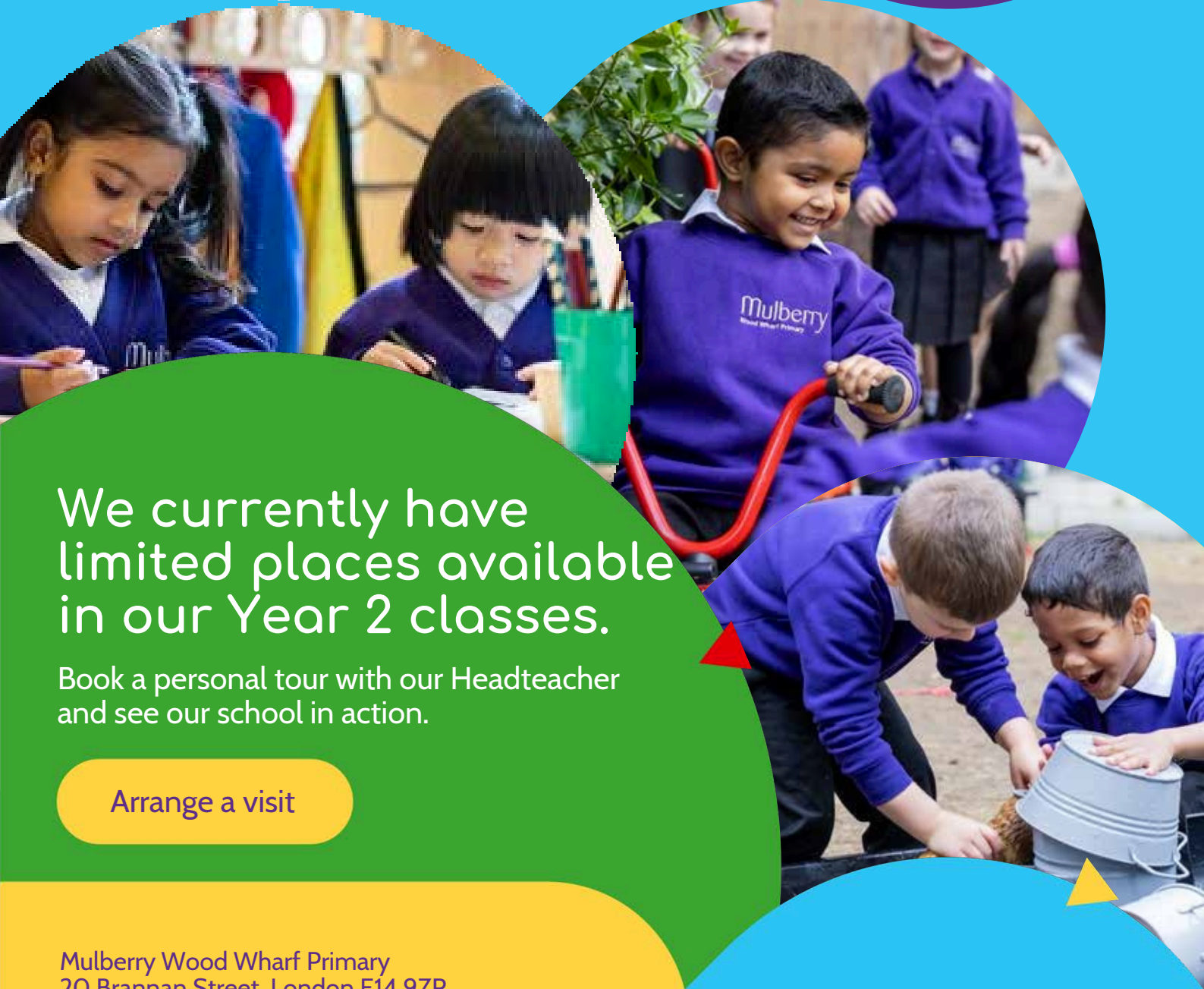
