## Sarah Jane's Reflection of the Week

We started our week with a whole-school assembly focused on our value of the week: Kindness. Together, we reminded ourselves of the many ways we show kindness every day, through our words, our actions and how we look out for one another. We also challenged ourselves to reflect honestly on those moments when kindness doesn't come so easily. We talked about times when unkind thoughts might pop into our minds, because after all, we are not robots. What matters most is recognising those moments and remembering that we have the power to choose a different response.

I absolutely loved hearing the children share the strategies they use to divert unkind thinking. One child explained that they imagine holding a warm cup of hot chocolate, taking a pretend sniff and a sip, and just like that, the unkind moment melts away. Another child shared that they sing the colours of the rainbow quietly in their head until the feeling passes. These moments were a beautiful reminder that it's okay not to be perfect, and it's amazing that we can pause, reflect and change our approach for the better.

At Mulberry Wood Wharf, kindness is not optional, it's who we are. Anyone who walks through our doors is shown kindness, care and respect. We proudly welcome everyone and show them the Mulberry Wood Wharf way: inclusive, compassionate and grounded in community.

I've been lucky to spend lots of time around the school this week. I loved my visit to Year 1, where the children were learning about animals in science, exploring mammals, birds, reptiles, fish and amphibians with such curiosity and enthusiasm. I also really enjoyed watching the NSPCC Speak Out. Stay Safe. assembly, which I felt was pitched beautifully and supports children to understand how to keep themselves safe and know when and how to ask for help.

I also spent time with Jen and Marwah looking closely at the children's assessments and writing in reception. I was so impressed by how far each child has come and how confidently they are working towards their next steps as they prepare to transition into Year 1.

My daily lunch check-ins with Year 3 continue to be a real highlight of my day. They keep me endlessly entertained with their ideas, stories and questions! Watching them sit together with their friends, laughing, smiling and looking out for one another, is something truly special. Their bond is magical, built over four years, and any children who have joined along the way have been welcomed into their world with love, respect and kindness. I also really enjoyed spending time with Year 3 listening to their thoughtful discussions and philosophical thinking about what the world might be like if there were no money, some incredibly deep thinking!

It's always lovely to hear about what our children get up to outside of school too. I was particularly impressed with Mia in Year 3, whose parents kindly shared a video of her competing in a rhythmic gymnastics competition last weekend. Her skill, rhythm and confidence were truly wonderful to see.

It's also been great to hear how our Year 2 and Year 3 children are challenging themselves with Times Tables Rock Stars. Adam in Year 3 has really embraced the challenge, reaching the top level in record time and even printing, laminating and bringing in his own certificate to school. What dedication!

With some sunny weather ahead, it's a lovely opportunity to get out and about and enjoy the outdoors together. As always, we gently remind families about the importance of close supervision, especially near roads, water and busy spaces.

As we approach Eid al-Adha next week, I would like to wish all our families celebrating a very happy Eid Mubarak. We hope you enjoy this special time with your families and friends, and that it brings joy, peace and togetherness.

I'll be heading up to Yorkshire over half term to spend time with family and get my little one outdoors. We have a favourite spot on The Chevin called Surprise Point, where we can look down over the town and even spot where Grandma and Grandpa live. It's hilly, rocky and perfect for exploring and scrambling and have a picnic. It's simple, free, and so much fun. A real chance to slow down and recharge.

I wish you all a lovely half-term break, and we look forward to welcoming everyone back on Monday 1st June.

As always, thank you to our families for your continued kindness and support, and a huge thank you to our wonderful staff team for their hard work, care and commitment to our children every single day.

# Growing Readers and Writers

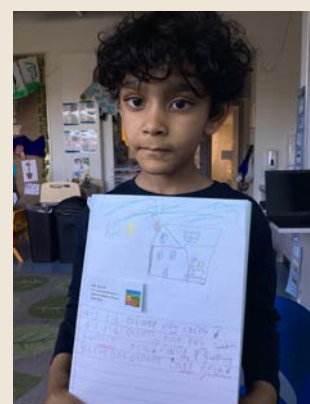
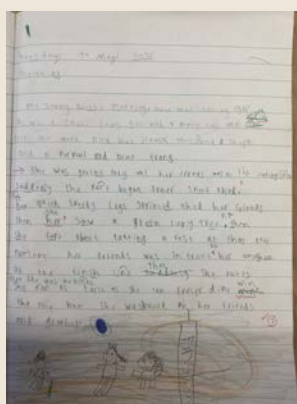
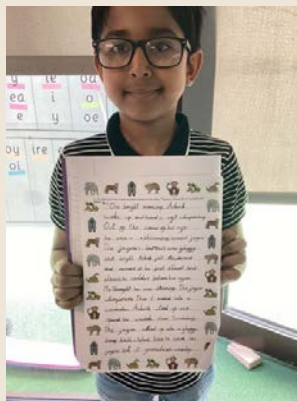
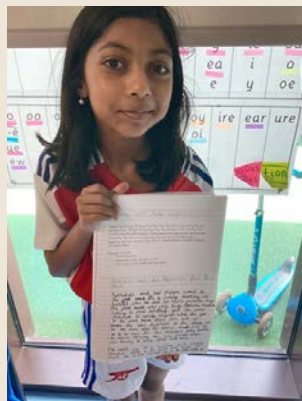

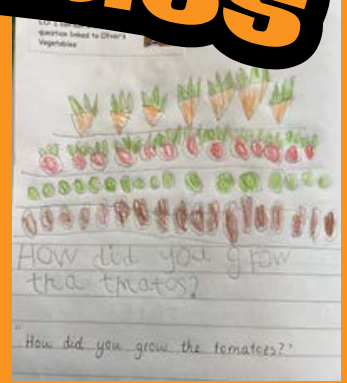
# Tiger Class

This week in Tiger Class, we have been very busy and creative! The children enjoyed using watercolours to paint a variety of fruits and vegetables, carefully mixing colours and adding lots of detail to their artwork.

We also had great fun celebrating National Numeracy Day through a range of exciting Numberblocks activities, helping us practise counting, number recognition and problem-solving skills in a playful way. With the warmer weather arriving, we have loved spending more time outdoors and making the most of the sunshine.

The children also worked incredibly hard on their writing by thinking of and writing their own questions for Oliver during our work on the book *Oliver's Vegetables*. We are very proud of all their effort and enthusiasm this week.

We hope everyone has a restful half-term break and we can't wait to return to school for the final term of Reception!



# Blue Whale Class



This week the children have enjoyed learning all about root vegetables through our story *Oliver's Vegetables*. The story encouraged lots of discussion about healthy eating and trying new foods. The children explored different root vegetables such as carrots, potatoes, parsnips, beetroot, and onions, learning that these vegetables grow underneath the ground.

They took part in a variety of hands-on activities including sorting, tasting, and discussing the colours and shapes of different vegetables. The children were very excited to discover where vegetables come from and how they help us stay healthy and strong. We also linked our learning to creative activities, role play, and sensory exploration, helping the children build their vocabulary and confidence while sharing their own experiences of foods they enjoy at home.

Lastly, we had a wonderful time celebrating Numeracy Day in Reception! Throughout the day, the children took part in lots of fun maths activities to help develop their confidence with numbers and problem-solving. The children enjoyed number hunts around the classroom and outdoor area, practised counting objects carefully, and explored shapes and patterns through creative activities. We sang number songs, played counting games with our friends, and used mathematical language during our play.

# Lion Class



Lion Class had a wonderful time writing their own stories based on Ready Steady Mo. It was fantastic to see the children using a wide range of adjectives and exciting verbs to make their writing more interesting and engaging. The children also worked hard to respond to feedback by checking their punctuation and spelling, as well as uplevelling their work with improvements and extra detail. Well done everyone! We are very proud of your efforts and creativity.

In Maths, Lion Class have been learning about coins and notes. We have been developing our understanding of the value of each coin and note and practising comparing amounts using the language greater than, less than and equal to.

We also celebrated National Numeracy Day by taking part in a range of maths word problems. The children worked hard to solve the problems and represented their thinking through drawings and pictures to help find the answers.

As we continue preparing for our phonics screening check, here are some extra links to practise at home. We have been working so hard and we are very proud of the progress they are making. Even a little bit of regular practise with sounds, blending and reading both real and nonsense words can make a big difference to their confidence. Thank you, as always, for your continued support at home!

# Panda Class

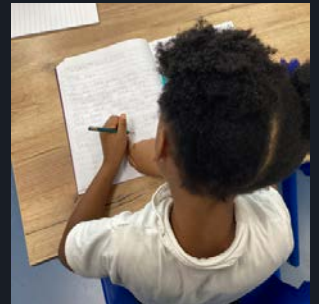
Panda Class have had a wonderful final week of half term, and we've been lucky enough to enjoy some lovely weather over the last couple of days too!

In Maths this week, we have been learning about money and recognising the value of different coins and notes. We discussed how, in today's world, many people use cards or phones to pay for things, but it is still so important for children to become familiar with real coins and notes. If possible, please encourage your child to explore and use money in everyday situations, as connecting learning to real life makes it much more meaningful and memorable.

In PSHE, the children reflected on the special people in their lives. They talked about what makes those people special and how they make them feel. It was incredibly heartwarming to see how much the children in Panda Class appreciate those around them and how confidently and thoughtfully they shared their ideas.

After the holidays, we have the phonics screening check coming up. Please ensure the children practise phonics in short bursts every day, revising their Set 3 sounds and blending skills. Just 5 minutes a day can make a big difference.

As we head into the half term holiday, please remember to stay safe, take care of yourselves, and enjoy the little moments that bring happiness. I can't wait to hear all about your adventures when we return in just over a week!



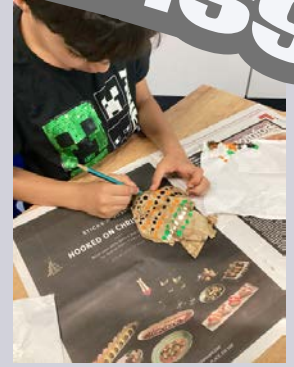
# Elephant Class

As we come to the end of another fantastic half term, I would like to say how proud I am of all the pupils in Elephant Class and the amazing progress they have made in their learning. They have truly shone in reaching important milestones on their writing journeys. The children have worked incredibly hard to plan, write and publish their own imaginative narratives, producing stories full of creativity, confidence and enthusiasm. It has been wonderful to see how much their writing skills have developed, and they should all feel very proud of their achievements.

In Maths, we have been focusing on telling the time, including quarter past, quarter to and minutes within the hour. Please continue to encourage your child to practise telling the time using an analogue clock at home, as this extra support really helps build their confidence. We also completed our Art unit on fish sculptures inspired by John Kindness. Pupils explored Aboriginal art from Australia and thoroughly enjoyed creating their own symbolic dot patterns to tell a story through art.

A huge thank you to all the pupils who have submitted such fantastic home projects about the Amazon Rainforest. We are also very grateful to parents for supporting and encouraging the independent learning involved in creating these detailed projects. It is lovely to see the time, effort and enthusiasm pupils put into their work when presenting to the class. If your child has not yet submitted this project, or any previous project, please take some time over the half term to complete it. We will arrange time for pupils to share their projects during the first week back.

# Penguin Class

We've reached the final week of the half term, and the children have continued to work incredibly hard while enjoying lots of exciting learning opportunities along the way.

In English, the children completed their own narratives inspired by There's a Rang-Tan in My Bedroom. They created imaginative stories where they became the main character and discovered their own chosen animal in their bedroom. The children came up with some wonderfully creative ideas and worked hard to include descriptive language, exciting events, and thoughtful endings in their writing.

This week, we also celebrated National Numeracy Day in Maths. The children took part in a fun activity linked to our current topic of time, where they explored different times of the day and discussed daily routines and events. It was a lovely opportunity to apply their learning in a practical and enjoyable way.

In PE, the children had great fun playing dodgeball. They practised their throwing, dodging, and teamwork skills while learning the rules of the game. It was fantastic to see the children encouraging one another, showing resilience, and enjoying being active together.

# Koala Class

In English, the children completed their stories inspired by The Great Food Bank Heist. They worked incredibly hard to use a range of sentence openers and "show not tell" techniques to express their characters' feelings. It was wonderful to see the children so immersed and enthusiastic about their writing.

In Maths, we revisited money, focusing on subtracting amounts and exploring different methods for exchanging when crossing over £1. The children showed great resilience and problem-solving skills throughout the week.

For National Numeracy Day, we had lots of fun discussing the importance of money and imagining what the world might look like if money did not exist. It was fantastic to hear the children thinking deeply about trade and the skills they could refine in a moneyless world.

In Science, the children explored shadows and investigated how different objects may or may not create shadows depending on their properties.

Overall, it has been a very busy and jam-packed half term, and the children should be incredibly proud of all they have achieved.

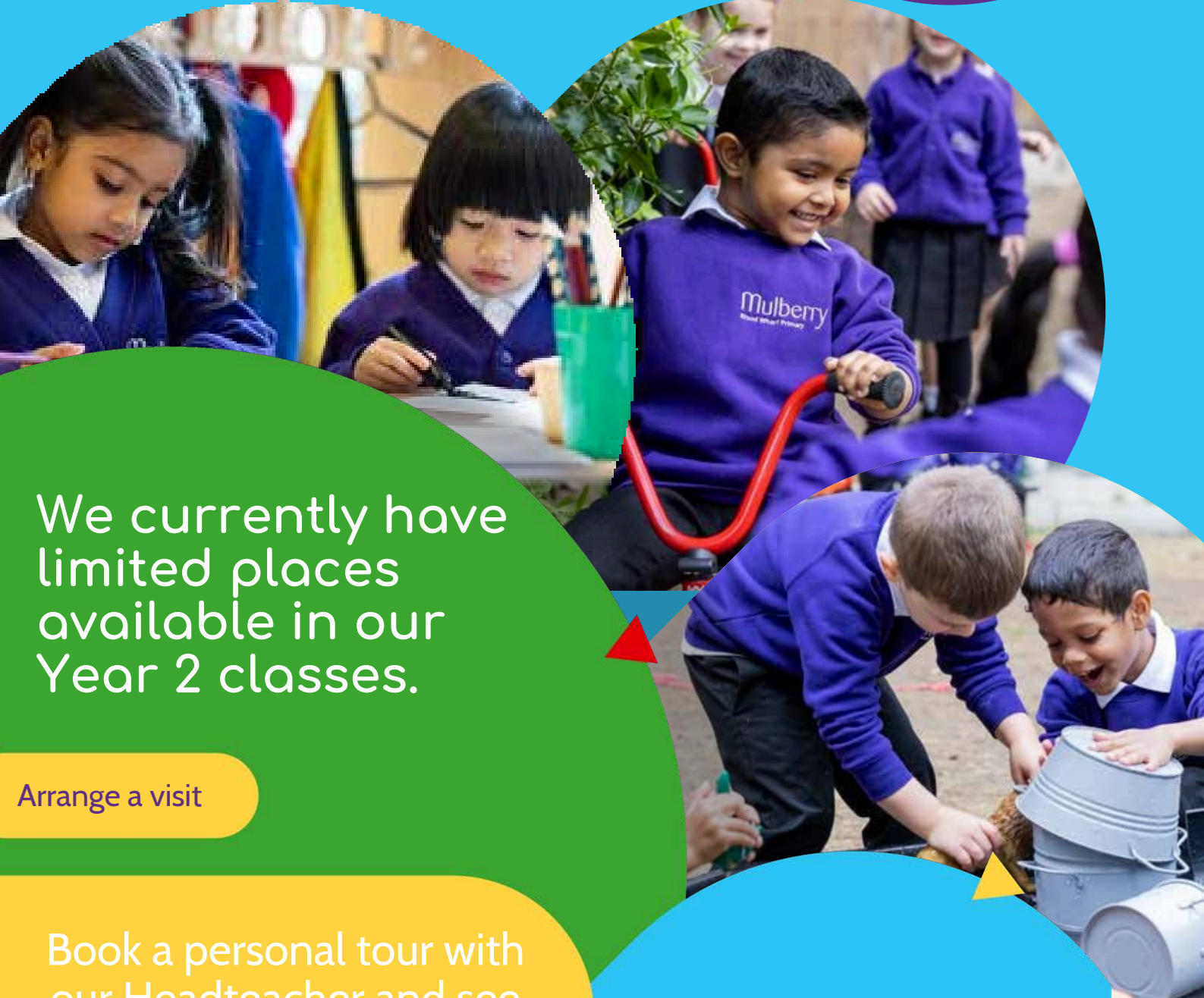
