Sarah Jane's Reflection of the Week

As we come to the end of another incredibly busy and joyful week at Mulberry Wood Wharf, I have been reflecting on our value of the week: Respect. Respect is something we talk about often with our children, not simply as a word, but as something we live each day through our actions, our conversations, and the way we care for one another and the world around us.

There has been so much wonderful learning taking place across the school this week. When I visited Year 2, I was immediately met with huge excitement as I discovered that an orangutan had apparently visited their classroom! The children were completely immersed in their learning and were eager to share some fascinating facts about deforestation. They explained that orangutans are losing their habitats because rainforests are being cut down, that forests help produce oxygen for our planet, and that protecting these environments is essential for wildlife and people alike. I absolutely love seeing our children engage with these global issues and develop such a deep understanding of the world around them. These are the moments that remind us that learning goes far beyond the classroom walls.

This week, we also had a truly brilliant day celebrating the 100th birthday of Sir David Attenborough. At Mulberry Wood Wharf, we strongly believe that every child should grow up knowing who Sir David Attenborough is and understanding the extraordinary work he has done to help us appreciate, understand, and protect our natural world. Did you know that he has spent over seven decades bringing the wonders of our planet into homes across the world?

If you are looking for something meaningful to watch as a family, I highly recommend some of his programmes such as Planet Earth, Blue Planet, or A Life on Our Planet. Watching factual programmes and documentaries together can be incredibly powerful for children. They build curiosity, develop knowledge, and often spark important family conversations about how we can all play our part in looking after our environment.

To make the day even more memorable, we all came to school dressed as animals, which brought so much fun, laughter, and creativity to the school! Each class also contributed something special to our developing biodiversity area.

Reception created bird feeders using recycled materials, Year 1 planted wildflowers to support pollinators, Year 2 created pond spaces with pond plants, and Year 3 are now putting their STEM skills into action by designing bug hotels, which they will soon begin constructing. Each class have also adopted their own animal which we will share more about soon. It has been wonderful to see children taking practical action to care for the natural world.

I also had the opportunity this week to meet briefly with the contractors who are supporting the next phase of our school development. They were incredibly warm and enthusiastic, and we have already started discussing opportunities for them to work with our children through workshops, helping them understand the wide range of careers involved in construction, engineering, and design.

Although the children will not see the contractors themselves, they will certainly notice and hear parts of the exciting work happening around the school. We want them to feel excited about what is to come, from our new kitchen facilities to our playground spaces, the opening of our second floor. It is a very exciting time for our school community.

Our value of Respect has also been shining through in the everyday interactions I have noticed across the school. This week, I overheard a group of children having a passionate debate about the upcoming FA Cup and whether Arsenal F.C. or Manchester United F.C. would come out on top! It was a fantastic reminder that we can support different teams, have different opinions, make bold predictions, and still listen to one another respectfully.

More broadly, I have seen so many lovely examples of respectful relationships in action, children complimenting one another on their outfits, celebrating each other's individuality, and speaking positively about what makes each person unique. These small but powerful moments really reflect the culture we are building together.

At Mulberry Wood Wharf, we are proud to be an inclusive school where everybody belongs, exactly as they are. We celebrate difference, we champion kindness, and we teach our children that respect means valuing every person, every voice, and every story. This is what makes our community so special.

As we head into the weekend, I know I'll be taking some of this week's learning home with me. I'm looking forward to spending time with my little one in our own small garden space, thinking about biodiversity, noticing the insects, birds, and plants around us, and talking about how even the smallest outdoor spaces can play an important role in supporting nature. Perhaps it might inspire some of you to do the same with your families. As Sir David Attenborough once said, "No one will protect what they don't care about; and no one will care about what they have never experienced."

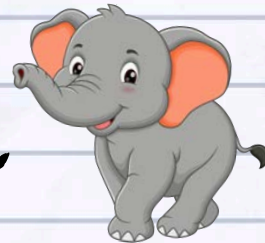

Blue Whale Class



This week, the children have had a very busy and exciting time celebrating Sir David Attenborough's 100th birthday. They came into school wearing wonderfully creative animal outfits, and it was clear to see the thought, imagination, and preparation that had gone into each costume. The children were so proud to share their outfits, and it was lovely to see such enthusiasm for learning about animals and the natural world.

In Reception, the children have continued observing their plants, and they returned to school on Tuesday to a huge surprise! The shoots had grown so big and tall and had developed into fully grown stems. The children were amazed by the changes and enjoyed talking about how much their plants had grown in such a short time.

In Literacy, the children have been discussing their favourite parts of the story The Enormous Turnip. It has been wonderful to see the children confidently recount the story and explain which part they enjoyed the most. They have shown great enthusiasm when retelling the events and joining in with the repeated phrases from the story.



Lion Class



During English this week, Lion Class discovered a mysterious drawstring bag filled with different items, including a vest, shorts, dirty socks, trainers and a medal. We made predictions about who the bag might belong to and used the word 'because' to explain our ideas. We also discovered and read the story Ready Steady Mo! Lion class chose their favourite setting and recreated it using a range of creative materials. We also practised writing sentences about Mo using the following conjunctions: and & but.

In Maths, we continued our learning about quarters in shapes and amounts. We learnt that a quarter is one of four equal parts. Using counters and grids split into four sections, we practised finding quarters of different numbers, including 4, 8, 12 and 20.

Today also marked Sir David Attenborough's incredible 100th birthday! It was wonderful to see so many children dressed as their favourite animals and proudly sharing their knowledge. We also enjoyed reading some of the fantastic letters written for Sir David as part of our home project this half term. We hope to send them to him soon, so please keep bringing them in!

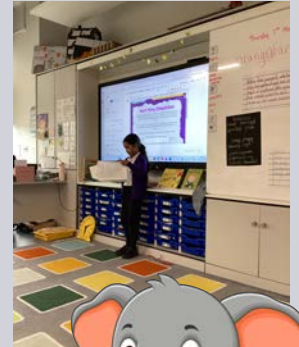


Elephant Class

Year 2 have had a fantastic week of learning! In English, pupils were very excited to begin exploring our new book, *There's a Rang-Tan in My Bedroom*. Everyone enjoyed discussing the story and its important message about protecting rainforests and wildlife. The children have been working hard to improve their writing by using expanded noun phrases and the power of 3 adjectives to create exciting setting and character descriptions.

In Maths, pupils have started learning how to tell the time using an analogue clock. We have explored o'clock and half past, as well as recognising quarter past and quarter to. Using handheld clocks to move the hands and make different times gave the children valuable hands-on experience and really helped to solidify their learning.

We ended the week with wonderful celebrations commemorating Sir David Attenborough. Pupils enjoyed learning about his legacy, his passions, and how he inspires us all to care for our world. Inspired by his work in the rainforests, the children created beautiful paper craft chameleons to celebrate their learning. They also were excited to take part in the collaborative work of creating our own school biodiversity habitat. We created pond planters using natural materials.



Penguin Class



It's been an exciting and engaging week in Year 2, with lots of memorable learning experiences for the children.

In English, the children were introduced to our new book *There's a Rang-Tan in My Bedroom*. To spark their interest, they arrived to find that a cheeky monkey had visited the classroom and made a mess! The children soon discovered that the orangutan was looking for a new home because her rainforest habitat was being destroyed. This led to some fantastic discussions about animals and their environments, and the children are very excited to continue exploring the story.

In Maths, the children have started learning about time. They have been practising how to tell the time to o'clock, half past, quarter past, and quarter to. Using clocks and practical activities has helped them build confidence, and many children are beginning to recognise these times more quickly.

In Science, the children have been building on last week's learning by exploring what happens when plants do not get what they need to thrive. They discussed how a lack of water, sunlight, air, or suitable temperature can affect plant growth, and made thoughtful predictions about what might happen in different situations. It has been great to see them applying their knowledge and thinking like scientists.

It's been wonderful to see the children so engaged and curious in their learning this week – we're looking forward to another great week ahead!



Koala Class

What a busy and exciting week we have had in Koala Class!

During our English lessons, we began reading Jabberwocky and used it as inspiration to design our own imaginative creatures. As the week progressed, the children built up ambitious vocabulary to use in their nonsense poems and thoroughly enjoyed inventing their own nonsense words!

Meanwhile, in Maths, we started our new unit on shapes. The children explored turns and linked them to different types of angles. They identified right angles and used right-angle checkers to investigate whether angles were smaller or larger than a right angle.

Over in Geography, we focused on the physical features of the UK. The children became "topographers" and used atlases to locate high points around the country. They particularly enjoyed discussing why people often choose to live in lowland areas but visit highland regions, such as Mount Snowdon, for hiking and adventures. It was wonderful to hear the thoughtful reasons they came up with for why people travel to mountains and hills.



LORNA'S UPDATE



This week has been full of excitement, creativity and purposeful learning across the school.

Children have been very excited about our David Attenborough celebrations, and I have loved seeing their fantastic animal outfits around the school. It has been wonderful to see such enthusiasm for learning about the natural world.

Our Year 2 children had quite the surprise on Tuesday, when a mischievous orangutan appeared to have caused chaos in their classroom. The excitement was clear when they shared the story with me afterwards in the playground, along with some excellent facts about deforestation. This experience led perfectly into their new focus text, *There's a Rang-Tan in My Bedroom*, and I cannot wait to see the writing they produce during this unit.

Meanwhile, our teachers have been working hard behind the scenes to further develop our writing curriculum. The aim is to maximise children's love of learning, excitement and creativity, while continuing to secure writing excellence across the school.

Looking ahead, there is not long now until the Year 1 phonics screening check. Please do continue to practise phonics sounds at home as much as possible with your child. Something is always better than nothing, and a little support really does go a long way.

Finally, a special shout out to Tiger class for 99% attendance. Keep up the great work!

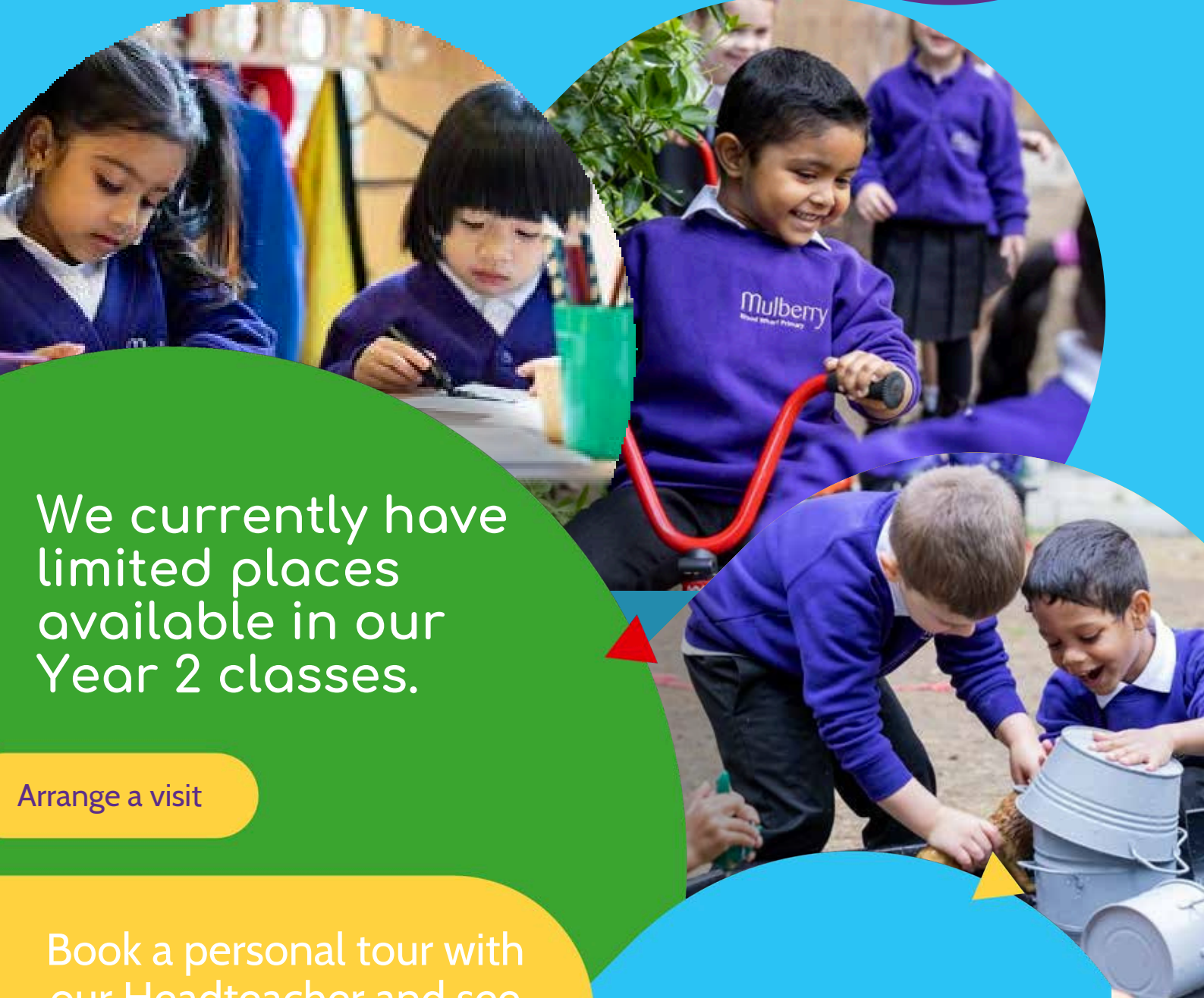
